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## **Executive Summary**

The Arizona Board of Regents has established a set of aggressive goals for 2025 aimed at increasing degree attainment among Arizona Residents and improving the state's economy. Delivering an affordable and quality education is at the center of that plan. With enrollment growing faster than any state in the nation demand for a postsecondary degree from one of Arizona's public universities is stronger than ever. In fact, Arizona is just one of four states that continue to attract new students. In addition, recently released figures indicate more Arizona students are both attending college and earning their degrees after high school.

Arizona's public universities hope to continue to build upon this recent success and realize that keeping college affordable is essential to increasing Arizona's degree attainment. College cost and available financial aid to offset those costs is ever more important to students and their families as they pursue a degree. Multiple factors determine the cost of obtaining a college degree, including the actual costs of educating the student, the amount of state appropriations the university receives to offset those costs, the resulting university tuition to cover the costs not covered by state appropriation and any financial aid awarded.

The board recognizes that the State, the universities, students and their families share responsibility for funding a student's higher education, and mandates that the universities endeavor to make effective use of all sources of financial aid to minimize the disparity between student and family resources and cost of attendance. The board has adopted several specific aims in the universities' distribution of financial aid:

- To support the enrollment and success of a diverse population of students by attracting highly qualified students and reducing the cost of attendance for students and their families with documented need;
- To provide flexibility to the universities in administering institutional financial aid to address Board initiatives, student needs, and resource availability;
- To ensure that the majority of institutional need and merit based financial aid is awarded to support Resident students at the undergraduate level;
- To take into account the special needs of students from groups that historically have been underrepresented in the Arizona University System; and
- To encourage independent entities such as the University Foundations to raise funds, develop endowments, and create long-term trusts to expand and enhance the available base of financial aid sources

# **Executive Summary**

The board desires to foster greater student retention and completion through the best possible utilization of financial aid. The board receives the financial aid report as part of its oversight mission to ensure the universities financial aid programs are making progress toward achieving this strategic vision.

Reviewing the financial aid information enables the board to advance student success by ensuring that financial aid operations and finances are as they should be, in order to support our students at the highest level. This in-depth evaluation of financial aid results in better decision-making, enhances accountability and helps the public to clearly understand how each university handles financial aid to achieve greater student success.

This report describes the amount of financial aid awarded during the previous academic year and projects anticipated financial aid for the current and ensuing fiscal years. Specific attention is paid to the number and value of scholarships and cash awards; distribution among Resident and Non-Residents, and needy and meritorious recipients.

The report also examines changes in funding levels over the last five years, reports on the average distribution of aid across different income levels and tracks student debt at graduation. The report does not detail each university's process for awarding and distributing financial aid to individual students. Information regarding each institution's student financial aid programs may be found on their financial aid website.

Finally, it is worth noting that financial aid is specifically defined as any form of assistance that comes from an organized body that assists a student with the costs of attending college. Traditionally, financial aid is awarded from several sources:

- the federal government,
- the university,
- private and external sources,
- the state,
- student employment such as the Federal Work-Study (FWS) program;
- Graduate assistantships, and
- student loans.

## **Executive Summary**

Financial aid is generally categorized as "gift aid" or" self-help." Gift aid does not have to be repaid. The recipient receives gift aid in varying forms such as scholarships, grants, tuition remission programs, or tuition waivers. Self-help is money that comes with additional costs to the recipient. There are two main types of self-help: loans and employment/work-study. Loans include federal student loans and private student loans provided by a private lender. The loan amounts presented in this report are both subsidized and unsubsidized and represent only those loans students who filled out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA).


The report will provide information and analysis for each source of financial aid for the Arizona public higher education system as a whole and for each Arizona public university individually.

### In Summary:

- Over the last six years, system wide financial aid from all sources has increased from \$1.5 billion to \$2.4 billion
- The total number of students receiving some form of financial aid increased almost 40 percent since academic year 2010. Over that same period, enrollment increased 29 percent
- Average need awards for undergraduates continued to increase and is now up 28 percent since academic year 2010
- Despite the increase in financial aid, since academic year 2010, the Net Cost of Attendance increased more than 75 percent
- 58 percent of students graduated with some level of debt. This is slightly lower than the 2014 peak of 60 percent
- At graduation, average debt for all undergraduates was \$13,814 and \$26,056 for all graduate students


#### Changes in financial aid since FY 2010:

- Student annual borrowing increased by \$360 million and represents the largest expansion in student aid
- The second largest increase was institutional aid (gift aid provided by the universities), which grew from \$366.3 million to \$622.3 million
- Federal aid showed moderate increase rising from \$163 million to \$260.4 million
- Private/External aid showed a slight increase from \$105.8 million to \$202.3 million
- State aid remained flat and employment aid (work study) showed a slight decline

 Over the past six years in Arizona the total amount of financial aid awarded to public university students has increase dramatically from \$1.539 billion to \$2.394 billion

## NUMBER OF STUDENTS AWARDED FINANCIAL AID, FYs 2010-2016




Changes in the number of students receiving financial aid since FY 2010:

- Students receiving Institutional aid increased from 66,780 to 93,279, a 28% increase over six years
- Federal aid recipients increased from 35,582 to 55,443 or 55.8%
- The number of students taking out new loans peaked at 104,429 in 2015, there was a slight, 1.5% decrease in 2016 to 107,789



## COST OF ATTENDANCE (COA), FYs 2010-2016




- Since FY 2010, the Cost of Attendance for Resident Students has increased nearly 52%. Cost of Attendance as used in this report included tuition, fees, books and supplies
- Net cost of attendance as used in this report is defined as the COA less aid package awarded to a student. Depending on family income levels, net COA increased on average from \$5,421 in FY 2010 to \$9,529 in FY 2016
- In FY 2016, Non-Resident COA was 73 percent higher then Resident COA it was 110 percent higher in FY 2010

# RESIDENT NET COST OF ATTENDANCE BY FAMILY INCOME, FYS 2010-2016





# AVERAGE MERIT AWARD BY UNDERGRADUATE RESIDENCY, FYs 2010-2016




## TOTAL NEED AID AWARDED BY STUDENT TYPE, FYs 2010-2016





# AVERAGE PERCENT OF NEED MET BY STUDENT RESIDENCY, FYs 2010-2016
























## AVERAGE NON-NEED GIFT AID PACKAGE BY STUDENT TYPE, FY 2016






### NUMBER OF RESIDENT FRESHMEN RECEIVING AID BY TYPE




#### **ALSO IMPORTANT:**

■ The National Bureau of Economic Research provides strong evidence that students who qualify for need-based grants (above the federal Pell Grant) are not only more likely than their peers of similar socioeconomic backgrounds to enroll in a public four-year university, but also show an increased probability to stay continuously enrolled in college, graduate within six years and accumulate credits at a quicker pace.

# **Financial Aid by Income**




# AVERAGE AMOUNT OF GIFT AID BY INCOME, RESIDENT STUDENTS RECEIVING AID, FY 2016











# **Average Amount of Debt at Graduation**




## STUDENTS WITH DEBT, FYs 2010-2016













# **Average Need Awarded by Student Type**











# TOTAL AMOUNT OF ACADEMIC AWARDS INCLUDING MERIT






# AVERAGE NON-NEED GIFT AID PACKAGE BY STUDENT TYPE, FY 2016






## NUMBER OF RESIDENT FRESHMEN RECEIVING AID BY TYPE



















# **Average Amount of Debt at Graduation**



















































## **COMMON DATA SET FINANCIAL AID DEFINITIONS**

**Financial aid applicant:** Any applicant who submits **any one of** the institutionally required financial aid applications/forms, such as the FAFSA.

**Financial need:** As determined by the institution using the federal methodology and/or the institution's own standards.

**Indebtedness:** Aggregate dollar amount borrowed through any loan programs (federal, state, subsidized, unsubsidized, private, etc.; excluding parent loans) while the student was enrolled at an institution. Student loans co-signed by a parent are assumed to be the responsibility of the student and **should** be included.

**Institutional and external funds:** Endowment, alumni, or external monies for which the institution determines the recipient or the dollar amount awarded.

**Need-based aid:** College-funded or college-administered award from institutional, state, federal or other sources for which a student must have financial need to qualify. This includes both institutional and noninstitutional student aid (grants, jobs, and loans).

**Need-based gift aid:** Scholarships and grants from institutional, state, federal or other sources for which a student must demonstrate financial need to qualify.

**Need-based self-help aid:** Loans and jobs from institutional, state, federal, or other sources for which a student must demonstrate financial need to qualify.

**Non-need-based gift aid:** Scholarships and grants, gifts, or merit-based aid from institutional, state, federal or other sources (including unrestricted funds or gifts and endowment income) awarded solely on the basis of academic achievement, merit, or any other non-need-based reason. Non-need-based aid that is used to meet need should be counted as need-based aid.

**Non-need-based self-help aid:** Loans and jobs from institutional, state, or other sources for which a student need not demonstrate financial need to qualify.

**Scholarships/grants from external sources:** Monies received from outside (private) sources that the student brings with them (e.g., Kiwanis, National Merit scholarships). The institution may process paperwork to receive the dollars, but it has no role in determining the recipient or the dollar amount awarded.

**Work study and employment:** Federal and state work study aid, and any employment packaged by the institution in financial aid awards

#### **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

**Aid to Needy Students:** Aid awarded to students who demonstrate financial need. May be awarded on the basis of merit.

**Aid to Non-Needy Students:** Aid awarded to students who do not demonstrate financial need. May be given for academic, artistic, or athletic talent, or on the basis of specific criteria such as being the child of a peace officer slain in the line of duty.

**Cost of Attendance:** The total estimated expense for a student to attend college during a specific time period, usually one academic year. It includes tuition and fees, room and board, transportation, books and supplies, and other personal expenditures and miscellaneous expenses.

**Demonstrated Need:** The difference between the price of attendance and expected family contribution determined by a standard federal methodology that calculates expected family contribution and defines items to be included in the price of attendance.

**Employment:** Employment is considered a form of financial aid when the job is on campus and/or funded wholly or partially by the federal or state government or the institution. Graduate assistantship earnings are included in the employment aid category. Based on need, the federal government provides work-study dollars.

**Expected Family Contribution:** The amount a student and family are expected to pay toward the student's education.

**Federal Financial Aid:** Financial aid administered by the U.S. Department of Education. The major programs are: Federal Pell Grants, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants, Federal Work-Study, Federal Perkins Loans, Federal Stafford Loans, Federal PLUS Loans, and Federal Direct Student Loans.

**Financial Aid Package:** The total financial aid a student receives. Federal and non-federal aid in the form of grants, waivers, loans, scholarships, work-study, and other government/institution-funded employment are combined into a "package" to help meet the student's need.

**Gift Aid:** Any financial aid that does not have to be earned or repaid (i.e., scholarships, grants, and waivers). The majority of private/other aid is gift aid.

**Grants:** Grants are generally distributed based on financial need. The majority of grant funds are provided by the federal government (e.g., Pell, State Student Incentive Grant, etc.). The Arizona Board of Regents Financial Aid Set-Aside and Arizona Financial Aid Trust grants are also included in this category. Grants need not be repaid.

**Institutional Aid:** Aid provided by the institution a student is attending, including waivers, employment, part of the Financial Aid Trust Fund, Regents Financial Aid Set-Asides, and some scholarships.

**Loans:** Loans are monies borrowed that must be repaid with interest. Some federally funded loans are subsidized by the federal government, which pays the interest during the time a student is enrolled.

**Scholarships:** Gift money based upon a special ability such as high grades or artistic merit given to students enrolled in certain academic programs or awarded to students based on financial need.

**Self-Help Aid:** Financial aid that is generated by the student and/or family (i.e., loans and student employment).

**Tuition Scholarships:** Tuition waivers, which can be awarded for either resident tuition or nonresident tuition, that are annually allocated and awarded following ABOR Policies 4-301 and 4-302, which addresses tuition waivers.

**Waivers:** Waivers may exempt a student from paying all or a part of tuition. They generally do not involve the actual transfer of funds but are income foregone by the institutions. A very small proportion of waivers are funded by non-university sources.

# **Arizona Board of Regents Tuition Waivers**

- For children and spouses of Arizona peace officers, Arizona fire fighters or Arizona emergency paramedics and Arizona military service personnel, Arizona correctional officers, and Arizona National Guard members killed in the line of duty; and disabled Arizona National Guard members.
- Members of the Community College All-Arizona Academic Team awarded resident tuition waivers. For community college students selected as members of the All-Arizona Academic Team. Waivers are awarded to eligible students at the time of the annual All-Arizona Academic Team ceremony.
- Pilot Program for Tuition Wavier Scholarships for Students in the Foster Care System

# **Arizona Board of Regents High Honors Endorsement Tuition Scholarships**

A student who graduates from an Arizona high school and meets the following criteria can qualify for a tuition scholarship of 25% of in-state tuition at one of Arizona's state universities. The scholarship is valid for one year following graduation and is renewable for an additional three years based on university-determined criteria. To be eligible a student must:

#### PART 1 COMPETENCY COURSES

Students must complete all 16 Core Competency Courses by graduation with a B or better in each unit of credit awarded, or receive an acceptable score on the Advance Placement (AP) or a 4 on the International Baccalaureate (IB) exam for that subject matter.

and

#### PART 2 GPA

- Option 1: GPA: A minimum core GPA of 3.50 in the 16 competency courses on an un-weighted 4.00 scale OR for those districts which use a 5.00 scale for IB/AP/Honors courses, an equivalent core GPA on a weighted scale or
- Option 2: Class Rank: Student is in the top 5% of their high school graduating class.

and

#### PART 3 AIMS

Students must meet at least 1 of the following assessment options:

- Option 1: EXCEED Standards on all 3 tests of AIMS by the end of the junior year.
- Option 2: EXCEED Standards on 2 of the AIMS HS Tests by the end of the junior year and MEET Standards on 1 of the AIMS HS Tests.

Additionally, student would need to receive a minimum score of 3 on two Advanced Placement tests or a minimum score of 4 on two International Baccalaureate exams. AP/IB exams can be taken during the senior year

and

#### PART 4 ACT/SAT

Students must meet at least 1 of the following admissions test options and submit scores to the universities they are apply to:

- Option 1: At least 28 on the ACT test
- Option 2: At least 1300 on the SAT1 test (critical reading and math, excluding essay).

SAT test composite score range (Reading and Verbal): 1310-1600

#### **Provost's Scholarship**

Students selected based on a comprehensive review of high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores. Scholarship award is renewable for up to three additional years upon completion of established renewal requirements. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

Award requirements:

<u>Unweighted, core gpa range: 2.51-4.00</u> <u>ACT test composite score range: 24-36</u>

SAT test composite score range (Reading and Verbal): 1190-1600

## Deans' Scholarship

Students selected based on a comprehensive review of high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores. Scholarship award is renewable for up to three additional years upon completion of established renewal requirements. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

Award requirements:

<u>Unweighted, core gpa range: 2.00-4.00</u> ACT test composite score range: 20-36

SAT test composite score range (Reading and Verbal): 1010-1600

#### **University Scholarship**

Students selected based on a comprehensive review of high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores. Scholarship award is renewable for up to three additional years upon completion of established renewal requirements. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

Award requirements:

Unweighted, core gpa range: 2.00-4.00 ACT test composite score range: 18-36

SAT test composite score range (Reading and Verbal): 920-1600

## **National Scholars**

Students must be designated a National Merit Finalist.

## Award requirements:

Recipients must be recognized scholars by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). National Merit Finalists must also meet school designation deadlines as established by the NMSC.

# University Sponsored Academic Scholarships for Incoming Freshman who are Arizona High School Graduates

## **NORTHERN ARIZONA UNIVERSITY**

#### President's Scholarship

Students receive a tuition waiver renewable for up to three additional years.

Students receive a tuition waiver renewable for up to three additional years.

High School Core G.P.A: 2.9 – 3.29

## **Merit Scholarship**

Students selected based on Academic Index of grade point average and test score.

#### Award requirements:

• High School Core G.P.A:. 2.9 – 3.29

• SAT: 940 - 1359

## **Lumberjack Scholars Award**

Students selected based on and completion of all college preparatory (core) courses, and their grade point average within those courses.

#### Award requirements:

- No deficiencies in any of the 16 college preparatory (core) courses.
- Cumulative high school core grade point average of 3.5 required for award.
- No grade lower than a "B" in any of the required core courses.

## **UNIVERSITY OF ARIZONA**

#### **Wildcat Excellence Tuition Award**

Students selected based on an academic index such as high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores. Students receive a tuition waiver ranging from \$1,500 - \$11,000 renewable for up to three additional years. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

#### Award requirements:

- Academic Index of 160+ required for award.
- Cumulative High School grade point average of 3.0 required for award.
- ACT or SAT test score required for consideration of merit award.
- AP, IB, Honors, Accelerated and College credits taken during high school are also considered.

#### **Arizona Excellence Tuition Award**

Students selected based on an academic index such as high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores. Students receive a tuition waiver ranging from \$5,000 - \$17,500 renewable for up to three additional years. Non-Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

#### Award requirements:

- Academic Index of 150+ required for award.
- Cumulative High School grade point average of 3.0 required for award.
- ACT or SAT test score required for consideration of merit award.
- AP, IB, Honors, Accelerated and College credits taken during high school are also considered.

#### **National Scholars**

Students must be designated a National Merit Finalist, National Hispanic Scholar, or National Achievement Scholar by College Board. Arizona resident students receive an \$18,000 tuition waiver and non-Arizona residents receive an Arizona Excellence tuition waiver (based on academic index) plus \$5,000, both renewable for up to three additional years and a one-time \$1,500 cash award that may be used for a UA study abroad program. Scholars who complete an Undergraduate degree in 3 years may use the remaining year of eligibilty toward UA Graduate school tuition cost. Students designated a National Merit Semifinalist Arizona resident students receive an \$12,000 tuition waiver and non-Arizona residents receive an Arizona Excellence tuition waiver based on Academic Index plus \$2,000, both renewable for up to three additional years

#### Award requirements:

- PSAT test score requirement determined by College Board.
- Designated by College Board as a National Scholar, or National Merit Semifinalist.

#### Riase.Me Wildcat Excellence Tuition Award

Students selected based on high school academic coursework improvement, course rigor, college preparation participation, leadership, community service, grade point average, and test scores. Students receive a tuition waiver ranging from \$50 - \$4,500 renewable for up to three additional years. Arizona high school graduates from participating pilot high schools are eligible to receive this award.

## Award requirements:

- Cumulative High School grade point average of 3.25 required for award.
- ACT or SAT test scores are considered for merit award.
- AP, IB, Honors, Accelerated and College credits taken during high school are also considered.

#### Flinn Scholar Tuition Award

Students selected based on high school academic coursework, grade point average, and test scores who are Flinn Scholars designated by the Flinn Foundation. Students receive a tuition waiver to cover full tuition charges and mandatory fees that is renewable for up to three additional years. Flinn Semi-Finalists are offered an additional \$3,000, also renewable for up to three additional years. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

#### Award requirements:

• Flinn Foundation high school academic merit acheivements.

#### **Baird Scholar Tuition Award**

Students selected based on the high school nomination, academic coursework, leadership, grade point average, and test scores who are Baird Scholars designated by the Baird Scholar Selection Committee and approved by the Baird Foundation. Students receive a tuition waiver to cover full tuition charges and mandatory fees that is renewable for up to three additional years. Arizona high school graduates including public, private, home, and charter school students are eligible to receive this award.

#### Award requirements:

- Cumulative High School grade point average of 3.50 required for award.
- Admitted to the UA Honors College for high academic achievement.

#### **Transfer Tuition Scholarship**

Students selected based on community college academic coursework and grade point average. Arizona resident students receive a \$2,500 - \$3,000 scholarship and non-Arizona residents receive a \$5,000 renewable for one additional year. Both Arizona and non-Arizona community college transfer students are eligible to receive this award.

## Award requirements:

- Minimum 3.00 (Arizona resident) or 3.50 (non-Arizona resident) transferrable GPA
- Minimum of 36 and a maximum of 72 transferrable coursework units

## Phi Theta Kappa Tuition Scholarship

Students selected based on community college academic coursework and grade point average. Arizona resident students receive a \$5,000 scholarship and non-Arizona residents receive a \$10,000 renewable for one additional year. Both Arizona and non-Arizona community college transfer students who were a member of Phi Theta Kappa Honors Society are eligible to receive this award.

## Award requirements:

- Minimum 3.50 transferrable GPA
- Minimum of 36 transferrable coursework units

#### **UA Bridge Tuition Scholarship**

Students selected based on community college academic coursework and grade point average. Arizona resident students receive a \$2,000 scholarship renewable for one additional year. Arizona community college transfer students who are participating in the UA Bridge Program are eligible to receive this award.

## Award requirements:

- Minimum 3.00 transferrable GPA
- Minimum of 36 and a maximum of 72 transferrable coursework units.
