
FALL ENROLLMENT REPORT

FISCAL YEAR 2022



ABOUT THIS REPORT

This report provides enrollment data for students attending Arizona's public universities in the 2021-22 academic year and updates multi-year enrollment trends. Twenty-first day headcount is provided for each university and their campuses.

Within higher education, enrollment is generally expressed in student headcount or FTE terms. Student headcount is reported for the purposes of determining educational scale and measurement against metric goals. Headcount is defined as the number of full- or part-time individual students registered at a university for at least one credit hour on the 21st day of instruction. Student headcount is considered a broad measure of a university's educational reach, reflecting the number of individuals the university is educating at one time.

Student enrollment is counted across all education delivery modalities, including online and extended campuses. The report further disaggregates the data into undergraduate, graduate and total enrollment. Data is presented by demographics, full-time and part-time student enrollment semester credit hours, and residency status.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Public university enrollment is an integral component of advancing the state's goal to increase educational attainment and is a key focus for the board and universities as the state transitions to an economy where the majority of job skills demand education past high school, and most jobs that pay well require a four-year college degree.¹ Reporting enrollment is a necessary step in ensuring that Arizona's public universities are meeting their mission to provide access and produce the number of degrees required to support and improve Arizona's economy.

In fall 2021 – which falls within fiscal year 2022 – enrollment at Arizona's public universities increased with notable growth in the number of students taking online programs. In contrast, on campus traditional immersion student enrollment is slightly up from last fall when the COVID-19 pandemic influenced in-person enrollment. Arizona resident enrollment dropped 0.7 percent from last year, a concerning decline in an era where the state's workforce is increasingly reliant on skills gained through higher education.

During fall 2021, total student enrollment at Arizona's public universities was 212,714, a 4.0 percent increase over fall 2020. Online enrollment continues to drive much of the increase. While the universities continue to see increases in their online programs, the institutions are experiencing steady enrollment growth in out-of-state and international immersion students – traditional students taking in-person classes.

Arizona's Demographic Changes Pose Challenges to Future Enrollment Increases

In addition to the immediate enrollment shifts resulting from the recent pandemic, future undergraduate enrollment increases may become progressively more difficult as a result of declining Arizona birth rates during the Great Recession. Total K-12 enrollment is projected to be flat for the next few years and then begin to decline. Depending on net migration, the decline is expected to occur no later than 2025.² Without increases in the percentage of Arizona high school graduates that choose to enroll in a four-year degree program, demographic reductions may impact Arizona's long-term educational attainment levels.

Declining enrollment impacts the universities' financial models. Arizona's divestment in public higher education has resulted in the board and universities focusing on diversifying its revenue sources. As state support per student has been reduced, Arizona's public universities funded a greater percentage of their operations on the number of students enrolled at each institution as well as the mix of resident, nonresident and international students to ensure the universities remain financially strong. The slowing enrollment and the change in enrollment mix places greater financial pressure on the universities.

Total Enrollment Continues to Climb Due to Online Enrollment

Online degree program students now comprise 33.4 percent of the system's total enrollment. At Arizona State University, which has the largest online enrollment, approximately two out of five students are enrolled in an online program. Similarly, approximately two out of five Northern Arizona University graduate students are completing an online program.

Online education at the University of Arizona is anticipated to continue to expand in 2022 and beyond with the university's affiliation with the University of Arizona Global Campus, an independent nonprofit corporation that will operate as a separate institution accredited by the WASC Senior College and University Commission. Arizona's public university system has seen significant growth in online programs for years, largely fueled by ASU online. Online learning is expected to continue its growth in coming years.

Since fall 2017, online degree program enrollment within Arizona's public universities increased by 82.1 percent. In contrast, the system's traditional on-campus enrollment growth has slowed. There are 118,050 traditional immersion undergraduates enrolled on campus – a 1.6 percent year-over-year increase. On-campus graduate enrollment also saw an 8.2 percent increase from fall 2020.

Enrollment of Historically Underrepresented Populations Continues to Increase

Enrollment of historically underrepresented populations – Blacks, Hispanics and Native Americans – has increased by 2.7 percent from fall 2020, continuing a trend of continuous enrollment growth. In fall 2020, 8,288 Black undergraduate students were enrolled in Arizona's public universities. Arizona's public universities also enrolled 42,874 Hispanic undergraduate students and 2,362 Native American undergraduates.

Due to the continued increase in enrollment of Hispanic undergraduate students, UArizona and NAU are currently designated a Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSI) by the U.S. Department of Education. The designation is awarded to institutions with undergraduate full-time equivalent student enrollment that is made up of at least 25 percent Hispanic students.

- Arizona's public universities saw a 0.7 percent decrease in Arizona resident enrollment to 105,442.
- Arizona's public universities currently enroll 107,272 non-resident and international students, a 9.2 percent increase from fall 2020.
- Enrollment of Black, Hispanic and Native American students continues to increase.
 Students from historically underrepresented populations currently comprise 29.6 percent (63,252 students) of enrollment at the universities an 0.4 percent decrease from fall 2020 and 2.1 percent increase from fall 2017. NAU and UArizona are designated Hispanic-Serving Institutions.
- The undergraduate degree program with the largest enrollment at ASU is business with 9,601 students currently enrolled, nursing at NAU with 1,225 students and psychology at UArizona with 1,956 students.
- The master's degree program with the largest enrollment at ASU is special education with 2,409 students currently enrolled, organizational leadership at NAU with 236 students and business administration at UArizona with 564 students.
- Arizona's public universities have approximately 5,064 students enrolled in degree programs at statewide learning centers.
 - Since fall 2017, undergraduate enrollment grew 16.4 percent from 145,146 to 169,021. Graduate enrollment also increased during that time 29.8 percent from 33,651 to 43,693. This fall, the majority of undergraduate students enrolled in Arizona's public universities were Arizona residents. These 89,485 resident students were joined by 79,536 non-resident students of which 6,292 were international students.

ARIZONA PUBLIC UNIVERSITY ENTERPRISE **ENROLLMENT TRENDS**

Arizona State University

ASU enrolled 107,425 undergraduate students, a 3.7 percent increase of 3,816 students from fall 2020. Arizona residents comprised 48.3 percent of ASU's undergraduate students in fall 2021. Of the 55,546 non-resident students enrolled, 4,200 or 7.6 percent are international students.

ASU enrolls 42.6 percent of its students in online degree programs - 19.0 percent of which are Arizona residents. ASU's online degree program enrollment was 57,848 in fall 2021, which is a 7.1 percent increase from fall 2020. ASU online degree programs enrollment is comprised of three-quarters undergraduate and one-quarter graduate students with 42,709 online undergraduates and 15,139 online graduate students.

In fall 2021, ASU enrolled 540 students in statewide learning centers throughout Arizona, including locations in Gila Valley, Lake Havasu and Yuma.

ASU's undergraduate students are 54.8 percent female (58,905) and 31.2 percent (33,483 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations - Black, Hispanic or Native American, which is a 0.3 percent enrollment increase from fall 2020 and a 3.3 percentage increase over fall 2017.

ASU's graduate enrollment for this fall semester is 28,304, surpassing last year's graduate enrollment by 3,125 students or 12.4 percent.

Northern Arizona University

NAU enrolled 24,162 undergraduate students, a 4.2 percent enrollment loss (1,066 students) from fall 2020 and a 10.8 percent enrollment loss (2,922 students) since fall 2017. Arizona residents comprised 65.8 percent of NAU's undergraduate students in fall 2021. Of the 8,275 non-resident students enrolled, 401 or 4.8 percent are international students.

NAU enrolls 19.6 percent of its students in online degree programs - 60.2 percent of which are Arizona residents. NAU's online and degree programs enrollment without personalized learning was 4,940 in fall 2021, which is an 8.0 percent decrease from fall 2020. NAU online degree program enrollment is comprised of 67.0 percent undergraduate and 33.0 percent graduate students with 3,311 online undergraduates and 1,629 online graduate students. Another 686 students or 13.9 percent are enrolled in NAU's personalized learning programs. In fall 2021, NAU enrolled 2,274 students in statewide learning centers with locations throughout Arizona and partnerships with every community college in Arizona.

NAU's undergraduate students are 63.0 percent female (15,212) and 31.5 percent (7,617 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations - Black, Hispanic or Native American – which is a 0.3 percent enrollment decrease from fall 2020 and a 1.7 percentage increase over fall 2017.

NAU's graduate enrollment for this fall semester is 4,549, surpassing last year's graduate enrollment by 161 students or 3.7 percent.

University of Arizona

UArizona enrolled 37,434 undergraduate students, a 4.8 percent enrollment increase of 1,728 students from fall 2020. Arizona residents comprised 58.0 percent of UArizona's undergraduate students in fall 2021. Of the 15,715 non-resident students enrolled, 1,691 or 10.8 percent are international students.

UArizona enrolls 15.6 percent of its students in online degree programs - 27.5 percent of which are Arizona residents. UArizona's online degree program enrollment was 7,521 in fall 2021, which is a 16.0 percent increase from fall 2020. UArizona online degree program enrollment is comprised of 59.9 percent undergraduate and 40.1 percent graduate students with 4,507 online undergraduates and 3,014 online graduate students.

In fall 2021, UArizona enrolled 2,250 students in statewide learning centers throughout Arizona, including 110 at its College of Applied Science and Technology in Sierra Vista and 762 graduate students at the Phoenix Biomedical Campus. UArizona also enrolled students in Chandler, Douglas, Gilbert and Santa Cruz.

UArizona's undergraduate students are 55.7 percent female (20,861) and 33.2 percent (12,424 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American – which is an 0.5 percent enrollment decrease from fall 2020 and a 1.0 percentage increase over fall 2017.

UArizona's graduate enrollment for this fall semester is 10,840, surpassing last year's graduate enrollment by 440 or 4.2 percent.





Exhibit ASU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions






Exhibit ASU.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount





Exhibit ASU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Graduate Degree Granting Institutions






Exhibit ASU.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit ASU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.8: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit ASU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.19: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours



Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount




Exhibit NAU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit NAU.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount




Exhibit NAU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Graduate Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit NAU.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit NAU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.8: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit NAU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours



Exhibit NAU.FE.19: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.20: Twenty-First Day First-Time Undergraduate Headcount By Residency




Exhibit UA.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit UA.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount





Exhibit UA.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount Growth with National Comparisons

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Graduate Degree Granting Institutions






Exhibit UA.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit UA.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.8: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours



Exhibit UA.FE.19: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours


