ABOR, ACA Unveil 'SciVal' – A New Generation Research Tool

Database Boosts Research Collaboration among Universities and Private Industry

PHOENIX – The Arizona Board of Regents and the Arizona Commerce Authority are pleased to announce the development of a super-charged research engine that will vastly improve collaboration among our three universities and private industry while attracting research dollars and helping to boost the state's economy.

The **Elsevier's SciVal Experts** is a user-friendly online <u>Arizona public university research catalog</u> that provides access to real-time research within the state university system (link here for specific databases at <u>ASU</u>, <u>NAU</u> and <u>UA</u>), and to the teams of experts who are leading the initiatives.

Like the economy, the research world is becoming increasingly competitive on both a national and global scale. SciVal offers new solutions at the intersection of academia and business, and is designed to give fresh opportunities to university researchers, students, innovative companies, industries and entrepreneurs who are seeking to access the scholarly work and research taking place within Arizona's university system.

"University research plays such an enormous role in driving the state economy," said Eileen I. Klein, ABOR president. "We have aggressive goals aimed at helping Arizona strengthen its position in the global marketplace – one of which is to double university research expenditures to \$2 billion annually by 2020.
