ABOR Announces Membership of NAU Presidential Search Committee

(Phoenix, AZ) – The Arizona Board of Regents has announced the membership of the Northern Arizona University (NAU) Presidential Search Committee, which includes 28 representatives from ABOR; NAU administration, faculty, student and alumni leadership; Arizona community colleges; community and business leadership; Native American tribal government leadership and more.

Northern Arizona University President John Haeger has previously announced he will retire at the end of his current contract which runs through June 30, 2015. Haeger was appointed as president of NAU in 2001.

The Board of Regents has set qualifications for the members to serve on the Search Committee, which includes being considered a leader in their specific area of influence and possessing the time and ability to participate fully on the Search Committee. Members act as ambassadors of the Board of Regents during the search process and dedicate themselves to the success of the search process.

Search Committee members will participate in various constituency forms; gather input from various interested individuals and groups; assist in identifying essential presidential leadership characteristics; and meet with potential prospects and offer feedback to the other members of the Search Committee and the Regents.
