

# 2023 POSTSECONDARY ATTAINMENT REPORT





## ABOUT THIS REPORT

The Arizona Board of Regents 2023 Postsecondary Attainment Report examines the number and proportion of Arizona public high school graduates who enroll in postsecondary institutions within one year of graduation, as well as the number and proportion that complete a postsecondary credential within six years of graduation.

Data in this report uses graduation records from Arizona public high schools provided by the Arizona Department of Education, and postsecondary enrollment and completion records for these graduates from the National Student Clearinghouse. The enrollment data is for Arizona high school graduates from 2013 through 2022 and the completion data is for Arizona high school graduates from 2008 through 2017. The Arizona Board of Regents provides this report to inform the state's understanding of postsecondary enrollment and completion trends and the educational attainment challenges and opportunities in Arizona.

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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

### ONE OF ARIZONA'S MOST PRESSING CHALLENGE IS CULTIVATING A COLLEGE GOING CULTURE

Arizona is making incremental progress in increasing college enrollment and graduation rates among the state's high school graduates, according to the 2023 Postsecondary Attainment Report by the Arizona Board of Regents.

In 2022, 48.3 percent of Arizona's high school graduates enrolled in some form of postsecondary education, a slight uptick from the previous year of 48.1 percent. However, this enrollment rate still falls short of Arizona's pre-pandemic rate of 52.8 percent and lags the national average of 62 percent.<sup>1</sup>

Arizona's college enrollment data also highlights disparities in four-year college enrollment rates among historically underrepresented populations and their white and Asian counterparts. Year-over-year data show a decline in college enrollment rates for Black, Hispanic, and Native American students while the rates increased for white and Asian students. Closing the college enrollment gap is critical for Arizona to enhance its overall postsecondary attainment, especially considering prevailing demographic trends.

Establishing an environment that nurtures students' success in college is more critical than ever. Among Arizona's 2017 high school graduate cohort, 30.3 percent were able to successfully complete any postsecondary education after high school. College completion rates over the last five years for the most recent cohort are essentially flat, which has significant implications for the state. They hinder Arizona's ability to develop a highly educated workforce, ultimately impacting economic growth, the overall quality of life for its residents and the state's ability to compete in an increasingly knowledge-based economy.<sup>2</sup>

The challenges posed by Arizona's low college enrollment and completion rates are exacerbated by the state's high school graduation rates, which stand at 76.6 percent in 2022,<sup>3</sup> falling below the national average of 87 percent.<sup>4</sup>

Increasing postsecondary attainment — the percentage of adults who earn a college degree — leads to a more educated workforce, economic growth, and higher wages and quality of life for degree holders.

The Arizona Board of Regents and its public universities are committed to addressing the enrollment and completion disparities within Arizona and are diligently working to increase educational attainment across all subgroups by implementing strategies that will raise postsecondary attainment levels across the state.

## 2023 POSTSECONDARY ATTAINMENT REPORT TAKEAWAYS

- **Forty-eight percent of Arizona's 2022 high school graduates pursued education beyond high school.** Among the approximately 74,000 high school students who graduated in 2022, nearly half — 35,800 — enrolled in a postsecondary institution. Lists of the top twenty four-year and 2-year institutions ranked by the number of Arizona high school graduate enrolled one-year after high school is found on page 7. (See *Exhibit PE.1*).
- **Arizona's high school graduates' postsecondary completion trends are moderately increasing.** Among the 2017 class of high school graduates, 30.3 percent earned a certificate, credential or an associate or bachelor's degree within six years, the highest rate among previous cohorts in the report. Of those students, 23.2 percent earned a bachelor's degree, 2.9 percent earned an associate degree and 4.2 percent earned a certificate or credential. (See *Exhibit PC.1*).
- **Women enroll and complete college at much higher rates than their male counterparts.** 58 percent of Arizona public high school graduates who enrolled in a four-year college were female. That trend remains with completion as women represent 61 percent of four-year college completions. Between the high school graduating class of 2013 and 2017, the number of women earning a bachelor's degree had a noticeable variation. It started at 27.4 percent, declined in the following years, and then started to recover in the last two years. During that same period, Arizona men saw a similar decline and recovery. (See *Exhibits PE.7, PE.8, PC.7, PC.8*).
- **Arizona graduates from historically underrepresented populations enroll in higher education at lower rates than peers.** College enrollment rates at four-year institutions among Black, Hispanic, and Native American students declined from 2021 to 2022. In comparison, college enrollment rates increased 0.5 percent for white students and 2.8 percent for Asian students (See *Exhibits PE.7, PE.8*).
- **The college attainment gap persists among racial and ethnic groups.** The completion gap has shrunk since 2013, but Native American high school graduates only complete a bachelor's degree at 7.9 percent. Hispanic graduates complete at 14.8 percent and Black graduates at 16.8 percent. By comparison, high school graduates of Asian descent complete at 55.3 percent and White students at 31.2 percent. (See *Exhibit PC.8*).
- **College enrollment and degree completion increased for Arizona English language learners (ELL) and special education students.** In 2022, 30.8 percent of ELL students and 21.3 percent of graduating high school students who qualified for services under the Federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act enrolled in a postsecondary institution, an increase from the Class of 2021 of 30.2 percent and 20.0 percent respectively. The report's data show the percentage of degree completers also increased. ELL students that graduated in 2017 saw an increase in postsecondary completion with 9.3 percent graduating. The percentage of 2017 special education high school graduates with any postsecondary completion increased to 7.9 percent, up from 7.4 percent of 2016 special education high school graduates. (See *Exhibits PE.10, PE. 11, PC.10, PC.11*).

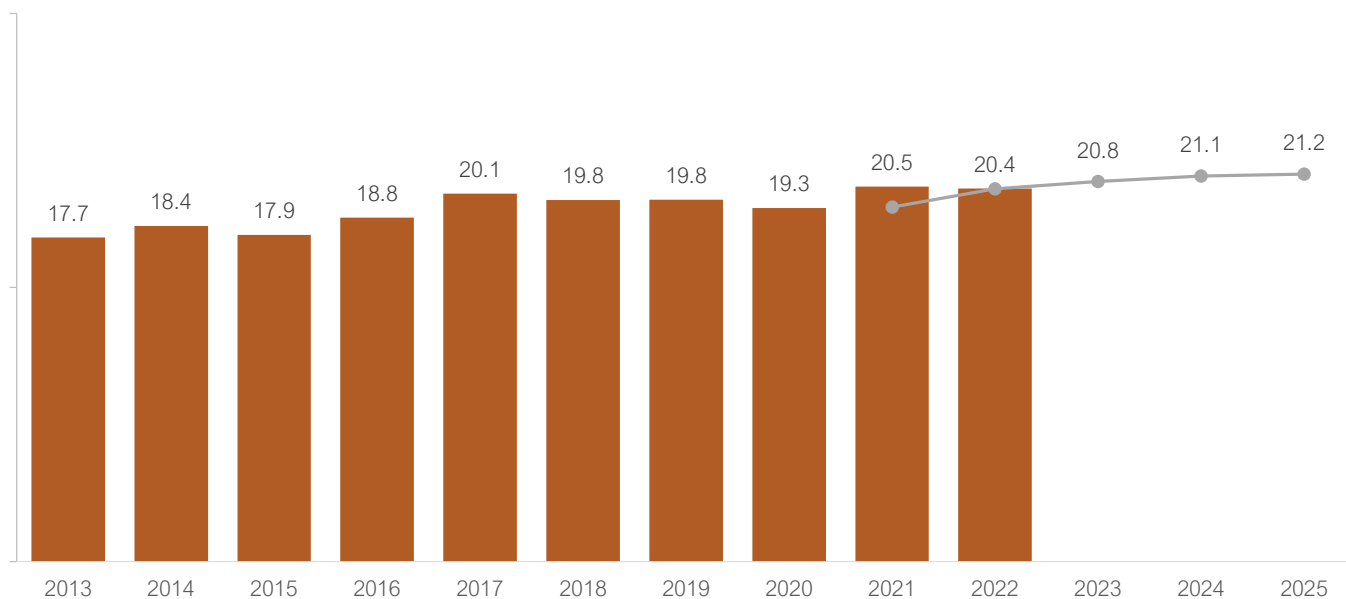
- **Arizona public universities enrolled more than two-thirds of Arizona high school graduates that chose a four-year degree program.** 30 percent of Arizona’s 2022 high school graduates pursued a four-year degree. Of the students that choose a four-year degree path, 68 percent choose to attend one of Arizona’s public universities. Lists of the top twenty four-year and 2-year institutions ranked by the number of Arizona high school graduate enrolled one-year after high school are found on page 7. (See Exhibits PE.1, PE.2, PE.3)
- **Arizona’s college enrollment and attainment data highlights the inconsistent performance of high schools in preparing students for higher education.** The top 10 percent<sup>5</sup> of Arizona high schools educate 27.9 percent students who enroll in a four-year college and 32.5 percent of students who complete a bachelor’s degree. Graduates from schools in the bottom 10 percent have a zero percent college enrollment rate. Creating conditions that foster two- and four-year college enrollment is critical to ensuring that all students have access to higher education and the opportunity to succeed in college and beyond. (See Exhibits PE.5, PC.5)
- **Arizona’s public universities aim to enroll more Arizona high school graduates.** This year, the report includes new data on the Arizona Board of Regents enterprise metric — the percentage of Arizona public high school students enrolled at Arizona State University, Northern Arizona University, and the University of Arizona. In 2022, Arizona’s public universities enrolled 20.4 percent of Arizona’s high school graduates and aims to increase this enrollment rate to 21.2 percent by the year 2025. (See Exhibit PE.0).

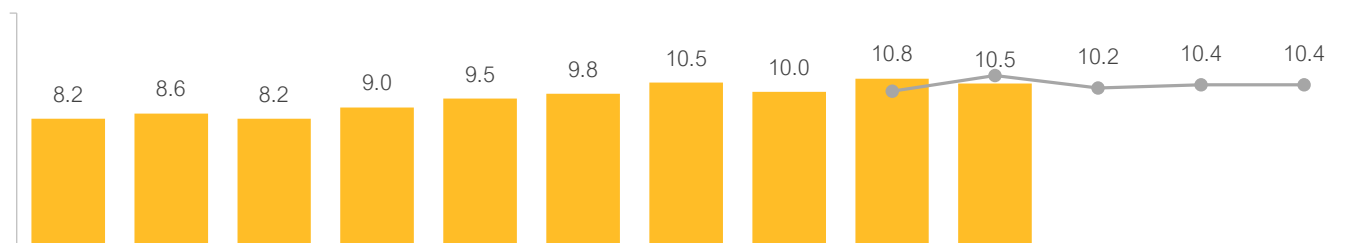

Exhibit PE.0: Percentage of Arizona Public High School Graduates Enrolled and Enterprise Goals

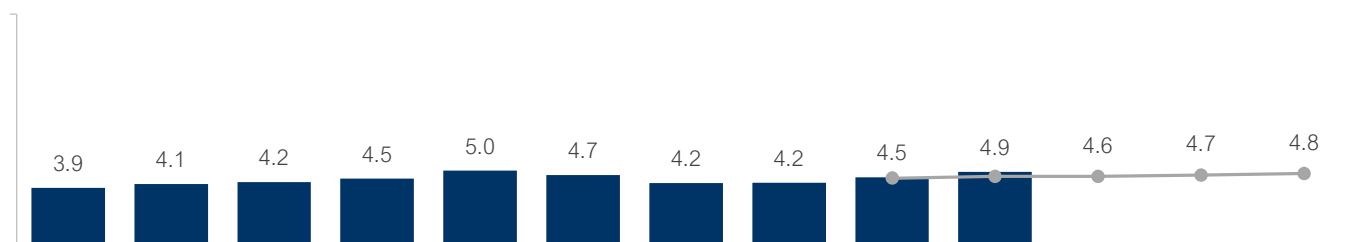

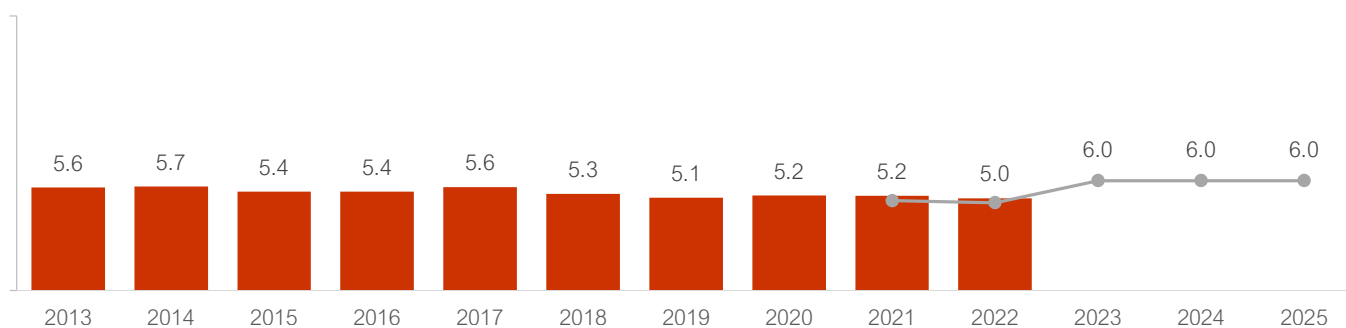

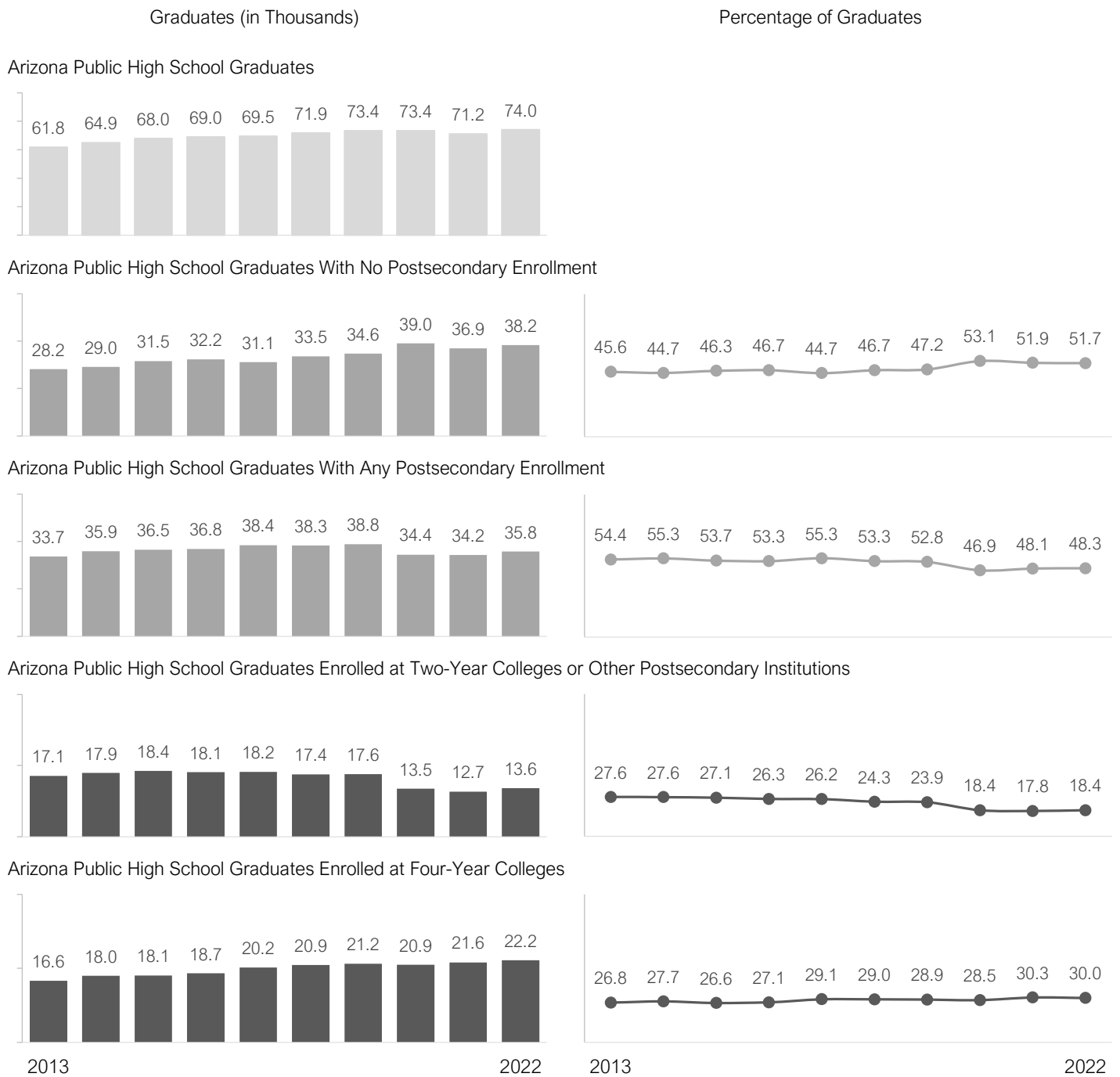

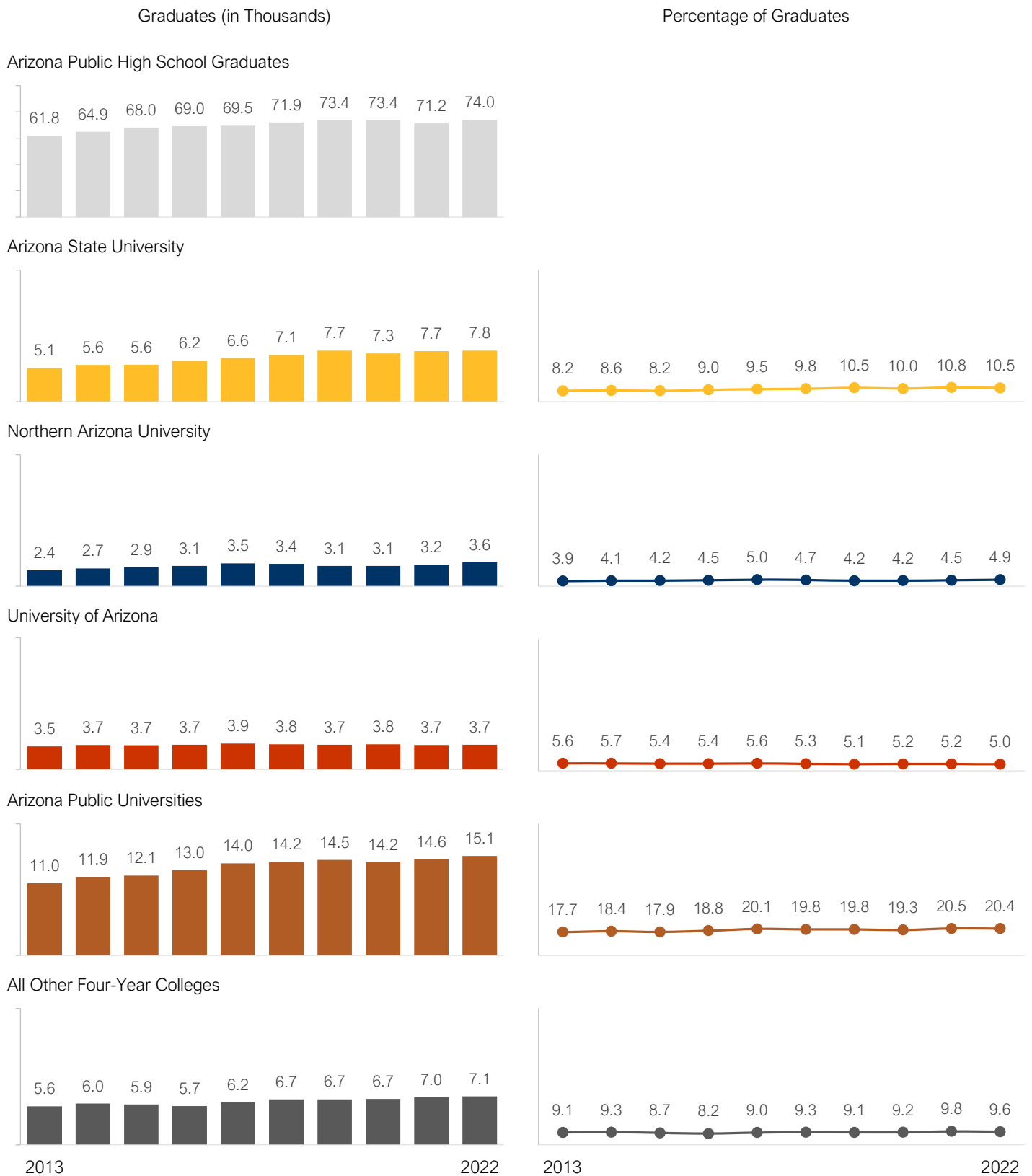
Exhibit PE.1: One-Year Postsecondary Enrollments

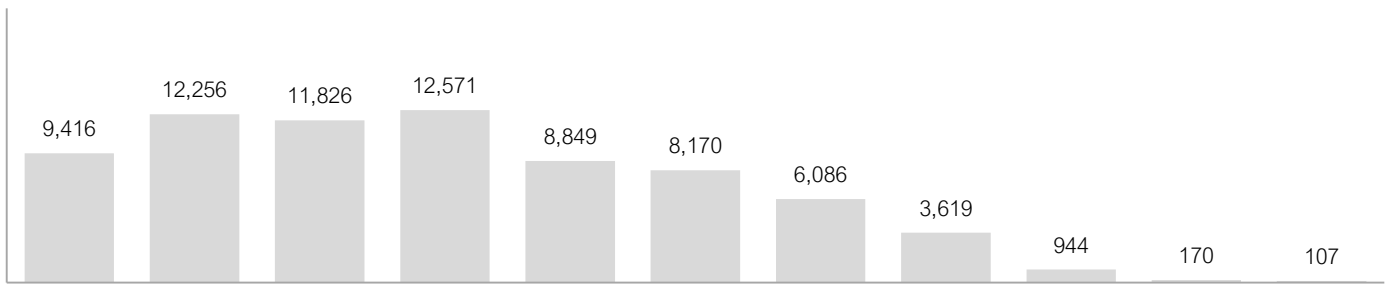

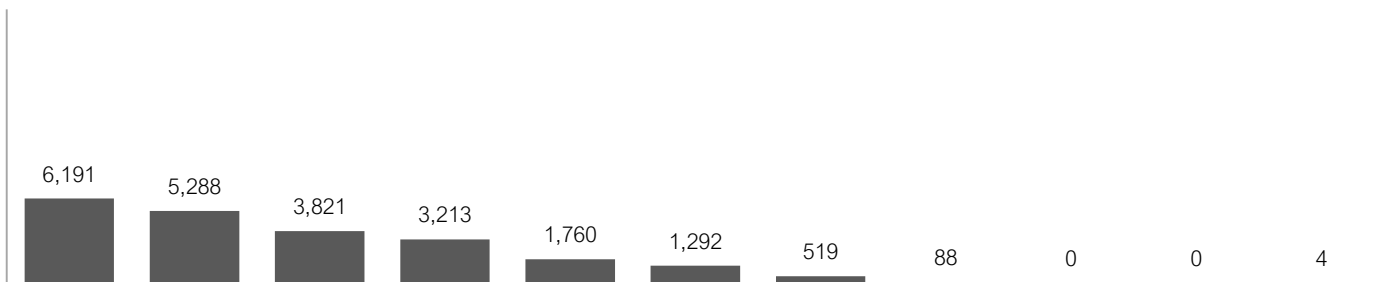

Exhibit PE.5: One-Year Enrollments of 2022 Graduates at Four-Year Colleges by Arizona Public High School Decile

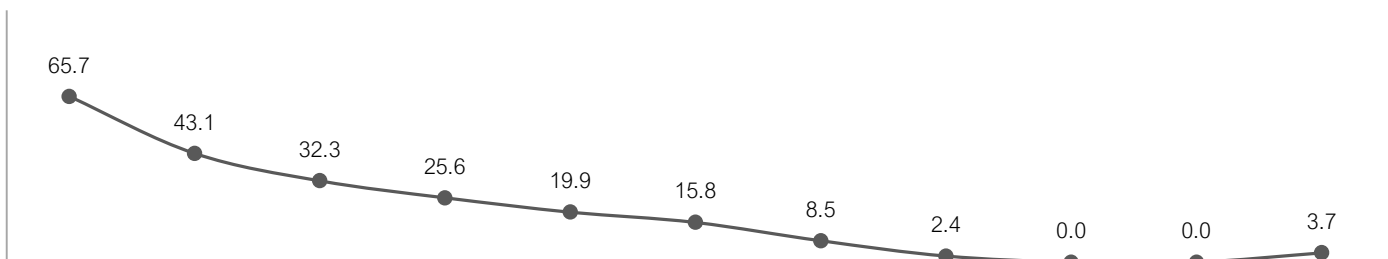
Graduates by Arizona Public High School Decile



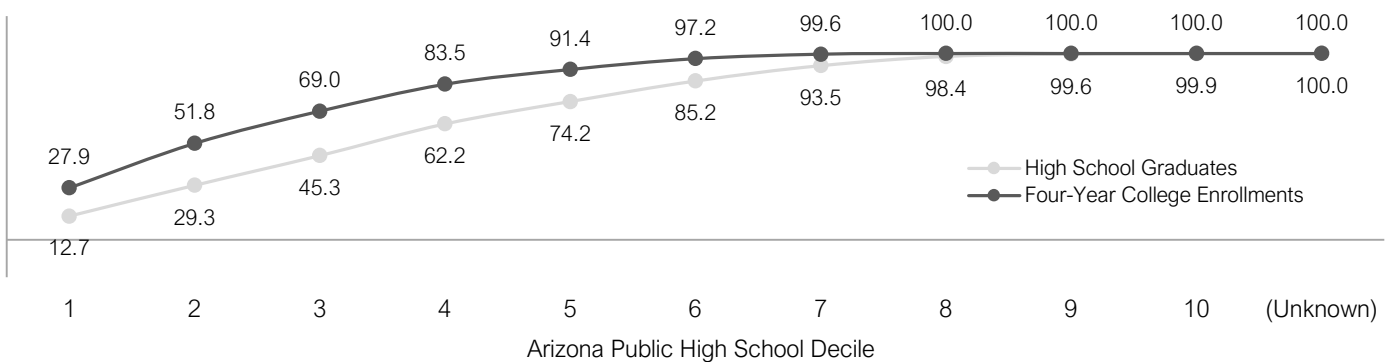
Graduates Enrolled at Four-Year Colleges by Arizona Public High School Decile

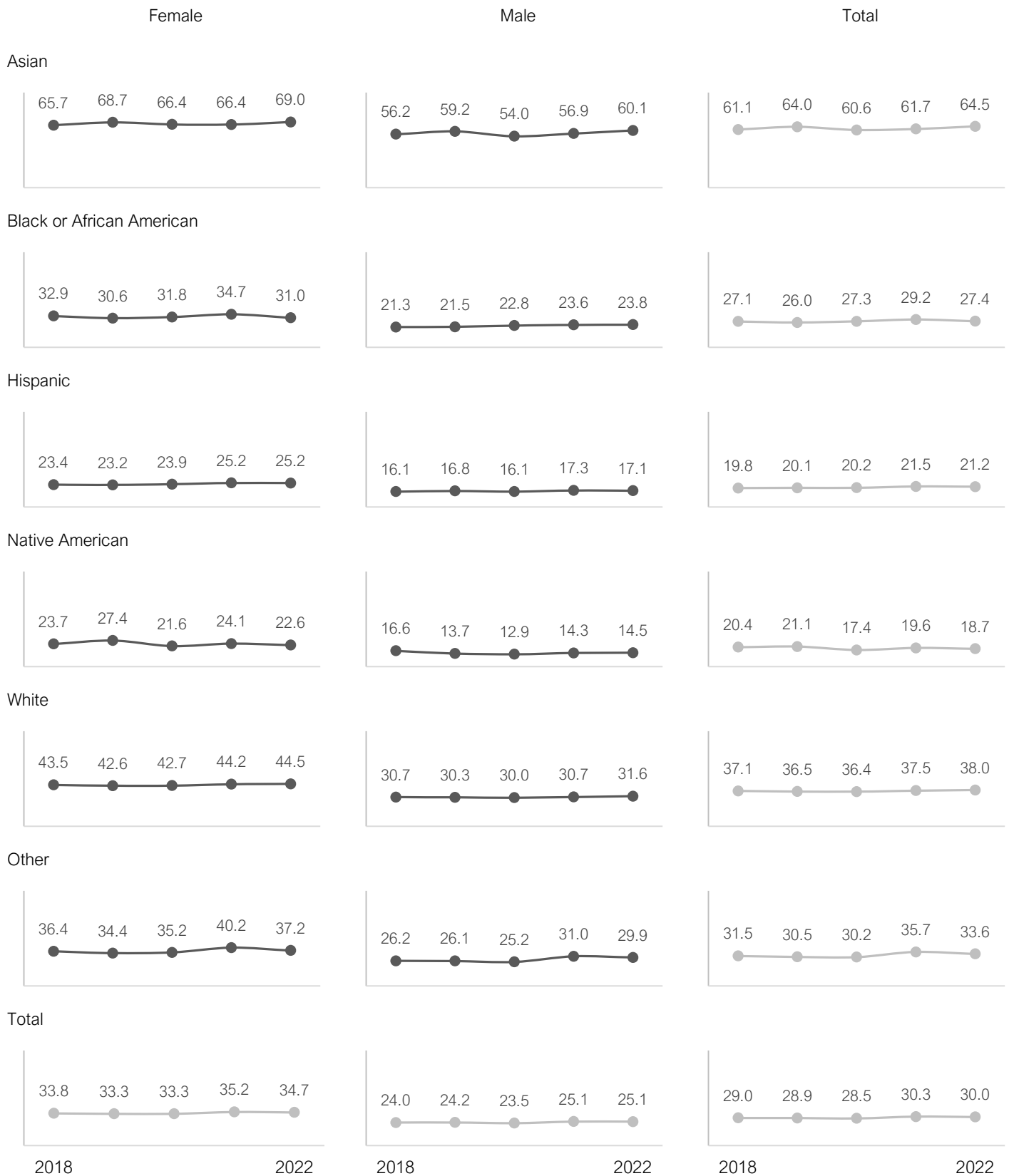

Exhibit PE.8: One-Year Enrollment Percentage at Four-Year Colleges by Race Ethnicity and Gender



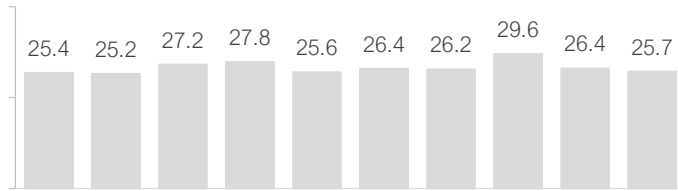

Exhibit PE.9: Economically Disadvantaged One-Year Postsecondary Enrollments

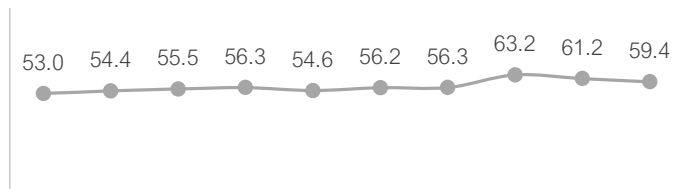
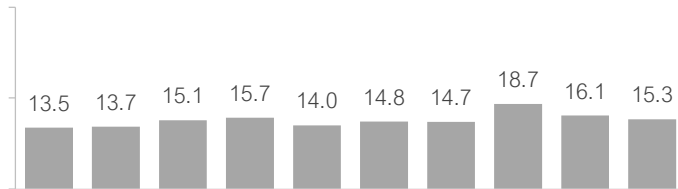

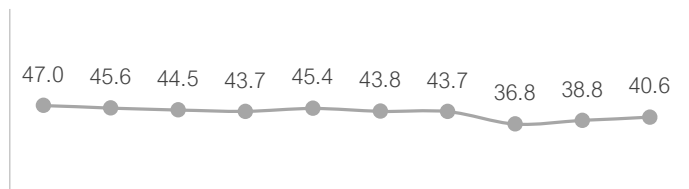
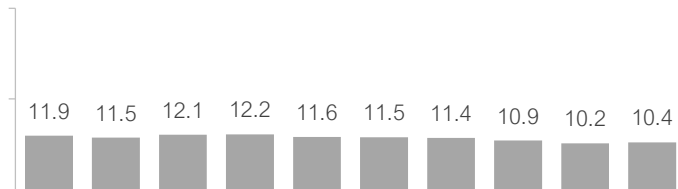
Economically Disadvantaged Arizona Public High School Graduates



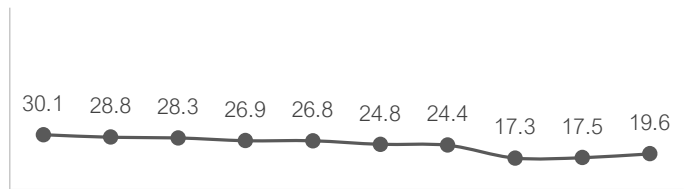
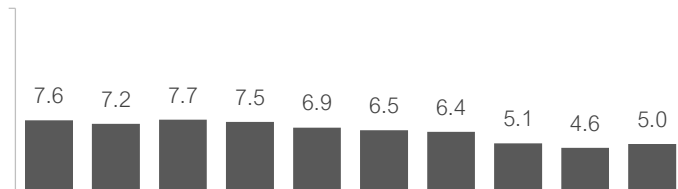
Economically Disadvantaged Arizona Public High School Graduates With No Postsecondary Enrollment



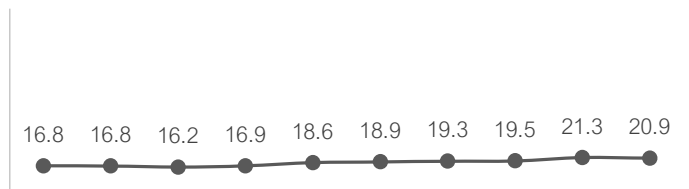
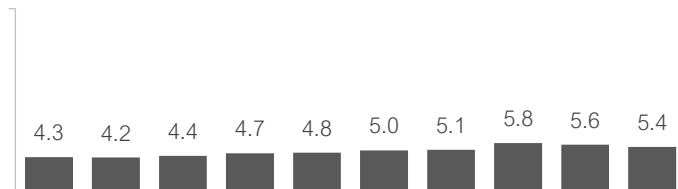
Economically Disadvantaged Arizona Public High School Graduates With Any Postsecondary Enrollment

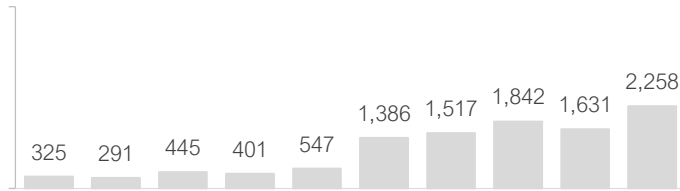

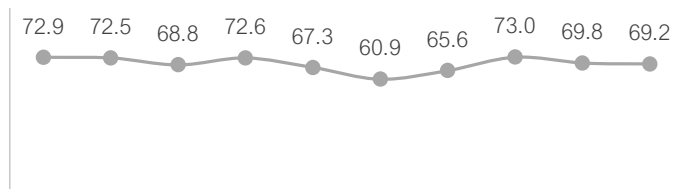

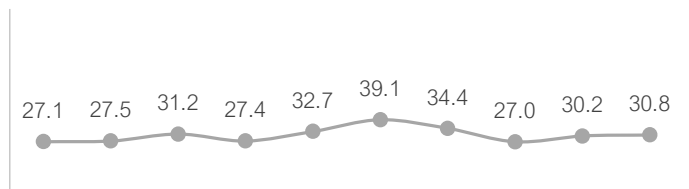
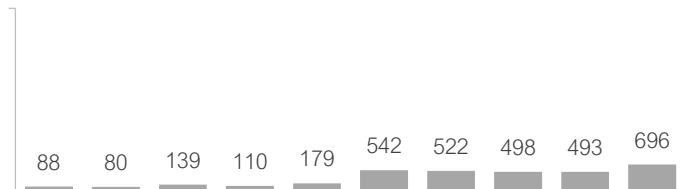


Percentage of English Language Learner Graduates

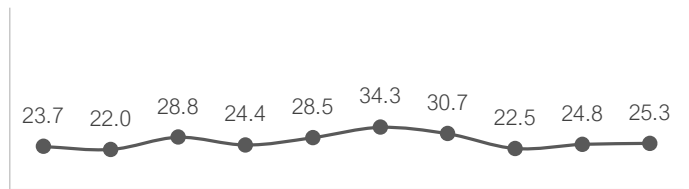
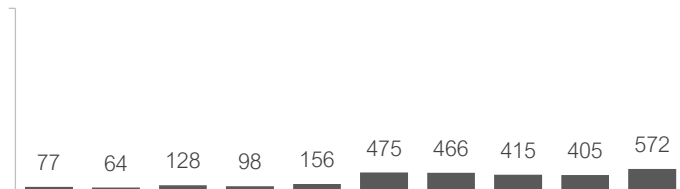
English Language Learner Arizona Public High School Graduates With No Postsecondary Enrollment



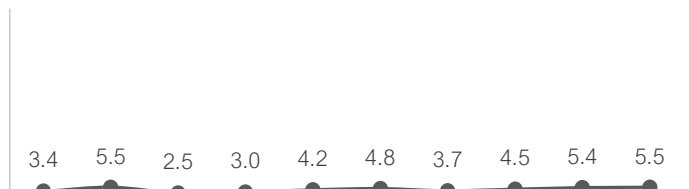
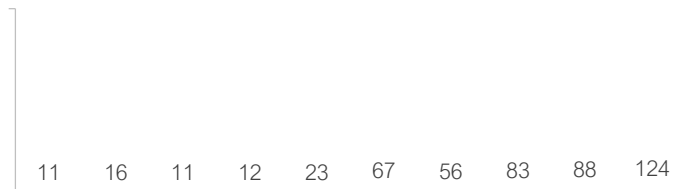
English Language Learner Arizona Public High School Graduates With Any Postsecondary Enrollment

Exhibit PC.1: Six-Year Postsecondary Completions

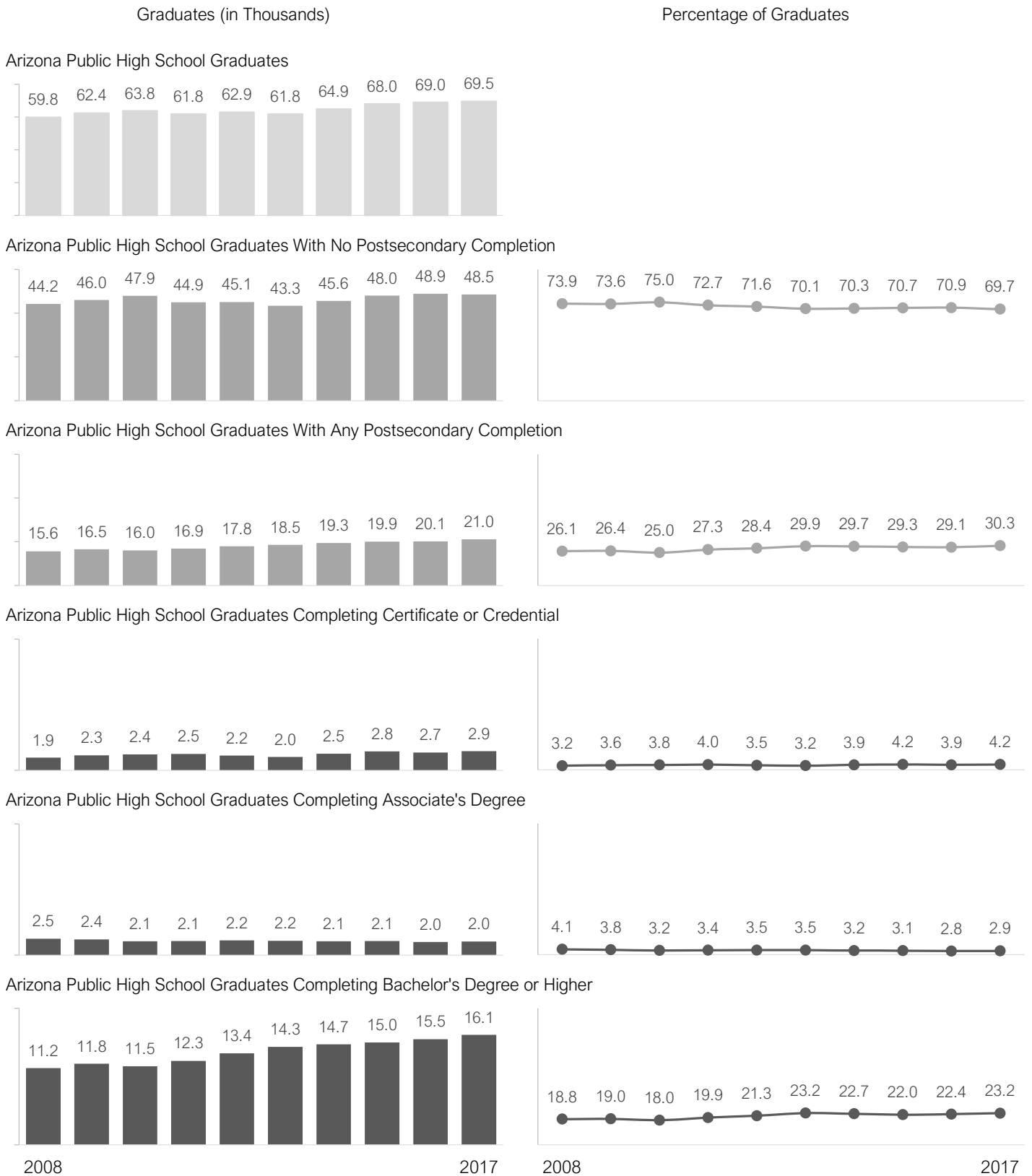
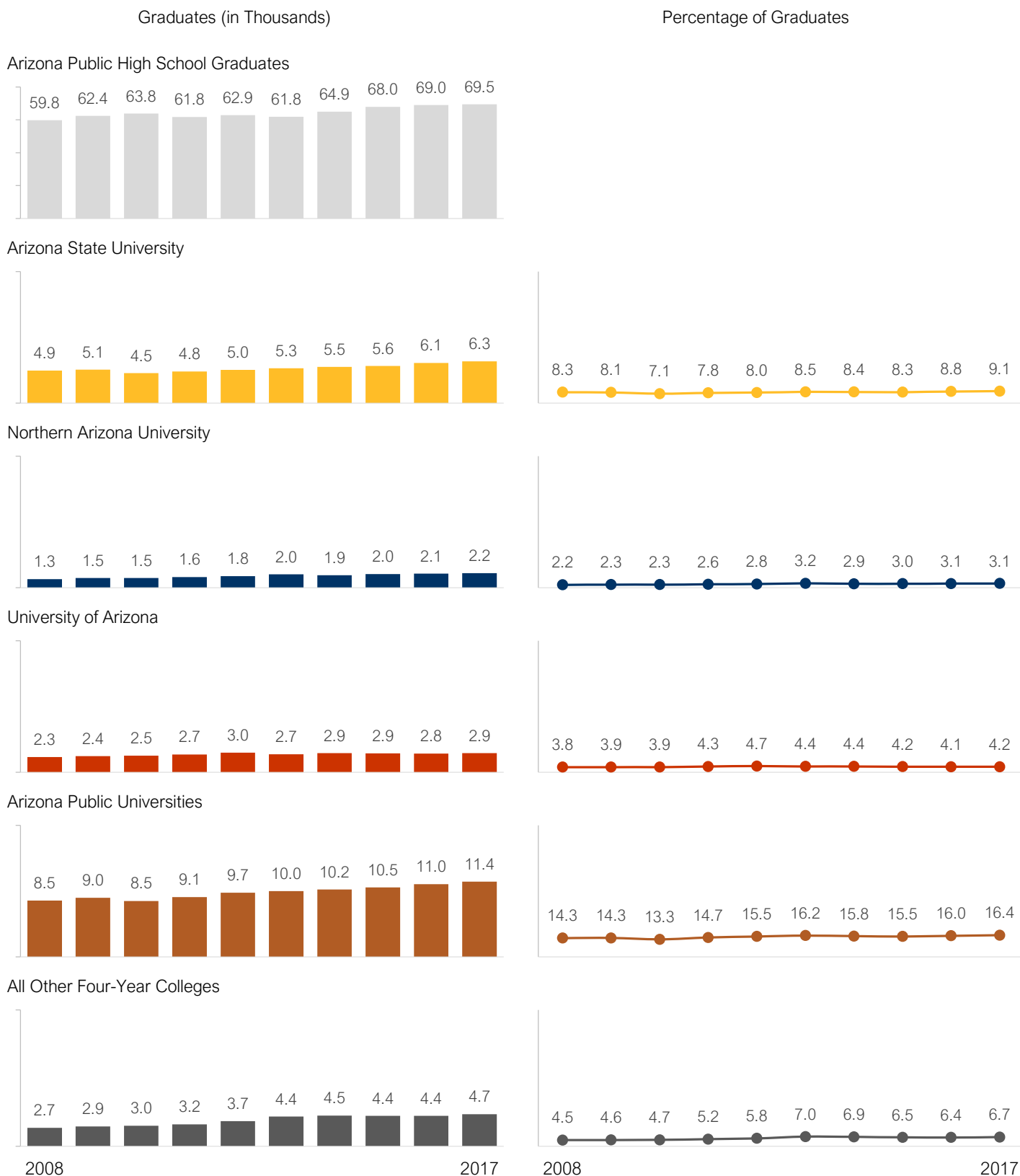


Exhibit PC.2: Six-Year Bachelor's Degree Completions

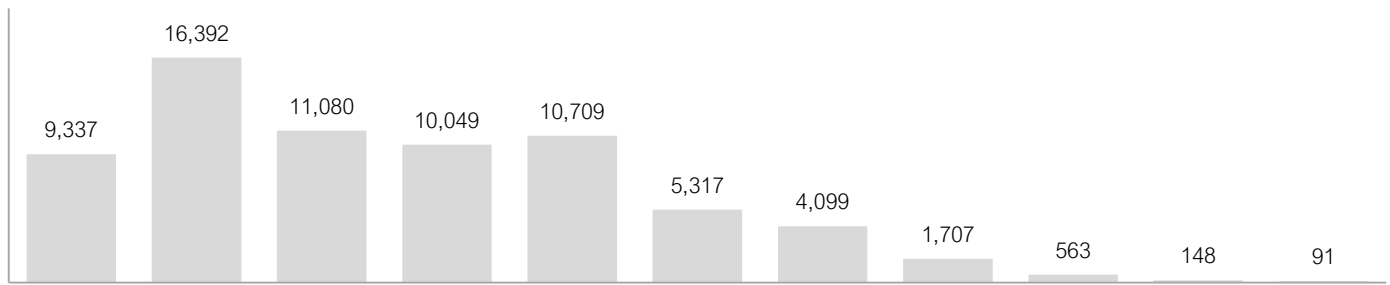

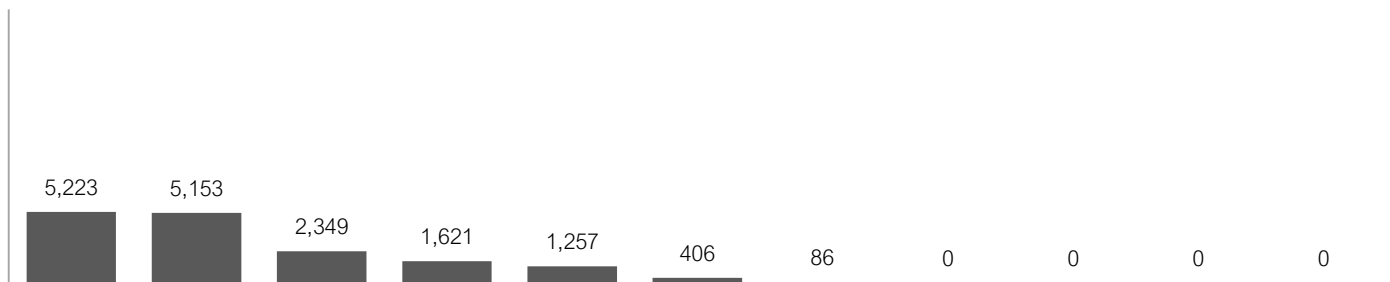

### Exhibit PC.5: Bachelor's Degree Completions of 2017 Graduates by Arizona Public High School Decile

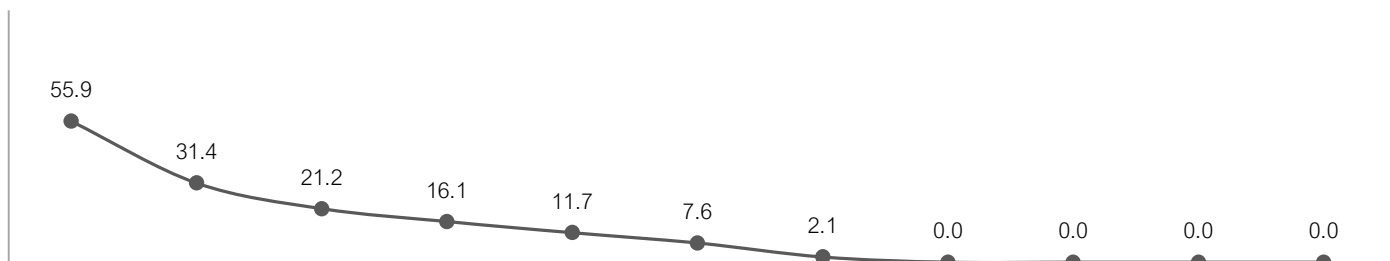

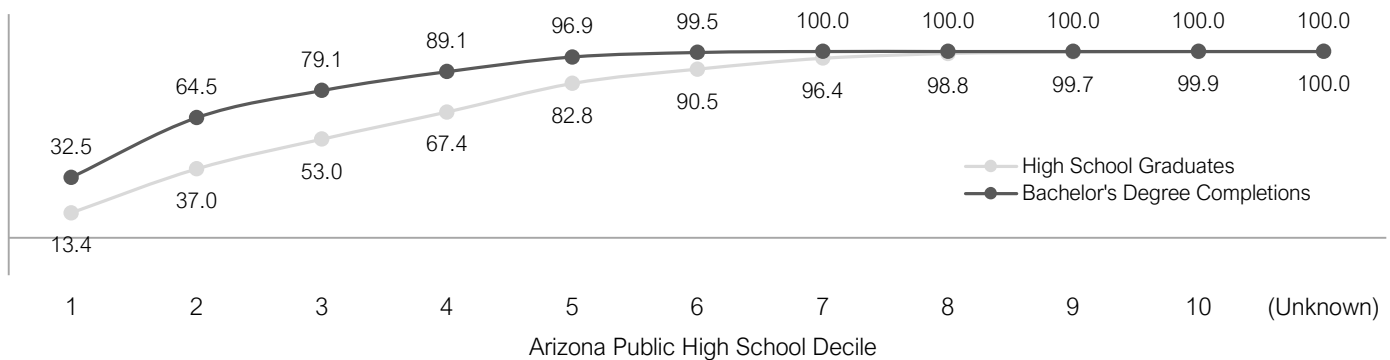
Graduate Bachelor's Degree Completions by Arizona Public High School Decile

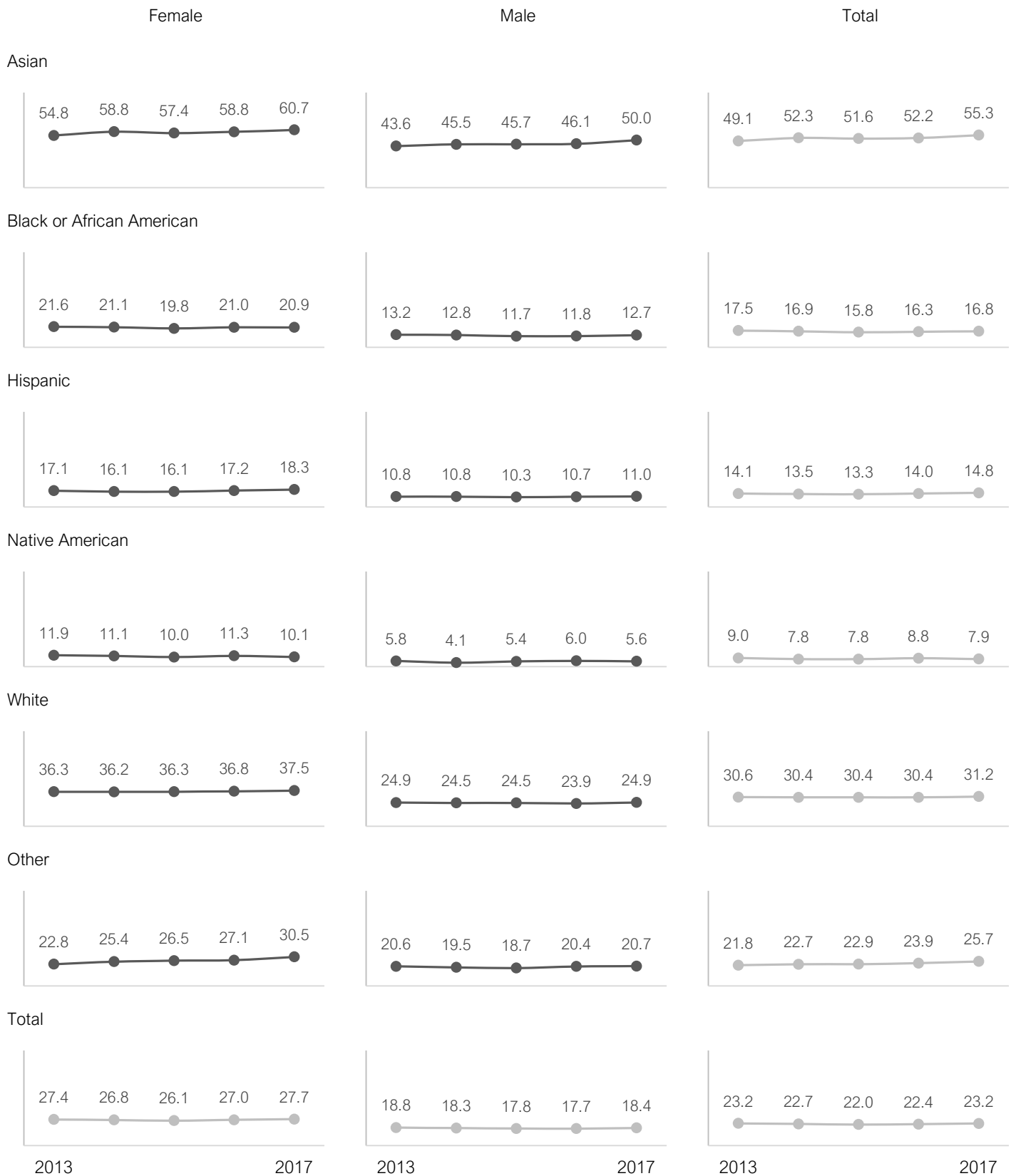

Exhibit PC.8: Six-Year Bachelor's Degree Completion Percentage by Race Ethnicity and Gender



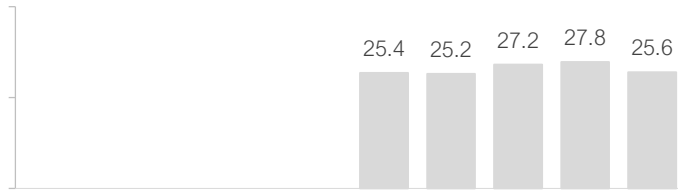

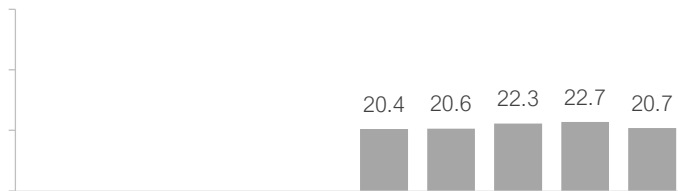

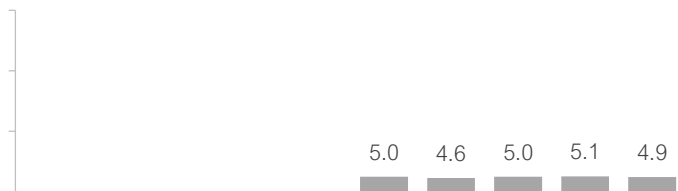

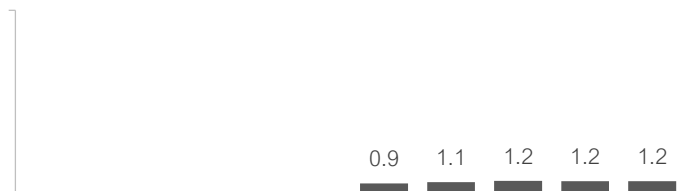
Economically Disadvantaged Arizona Public High School Graduates With No Postsecondary Completion



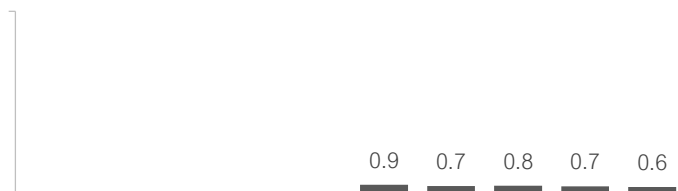

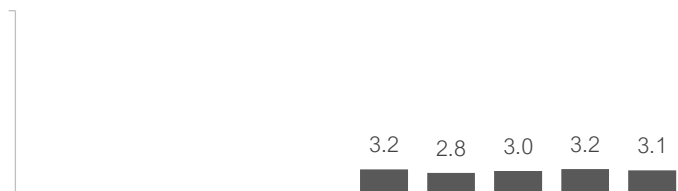

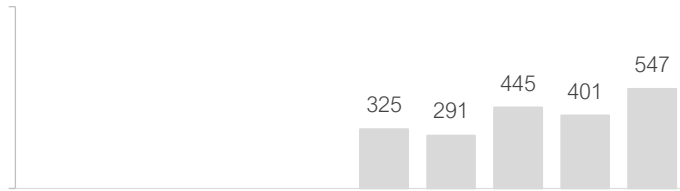

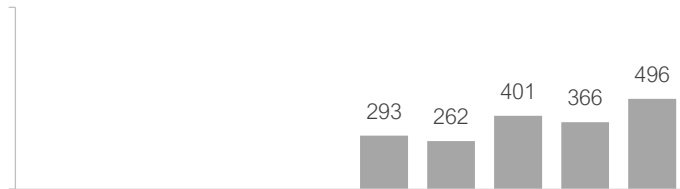

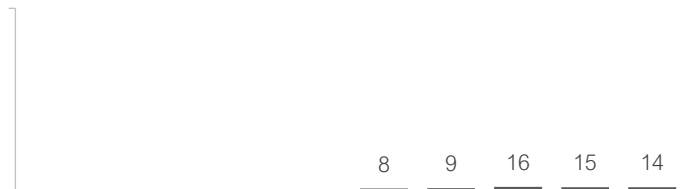

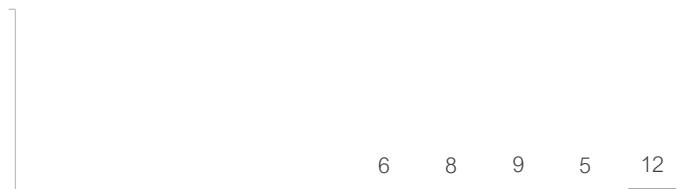

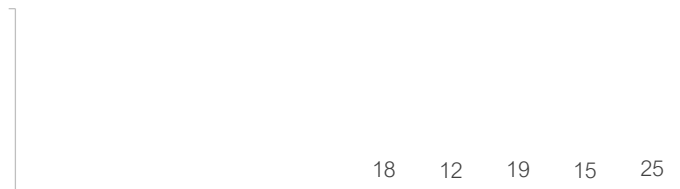

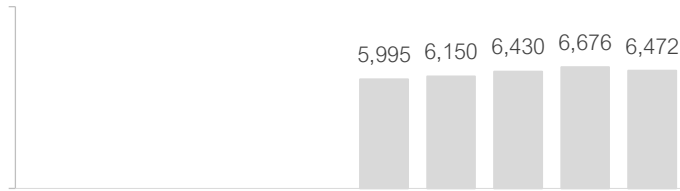

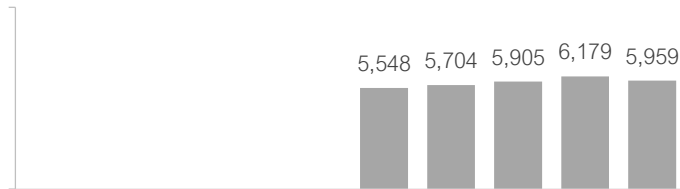

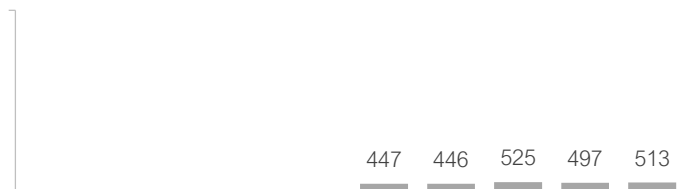

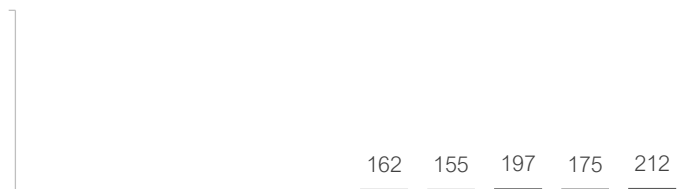

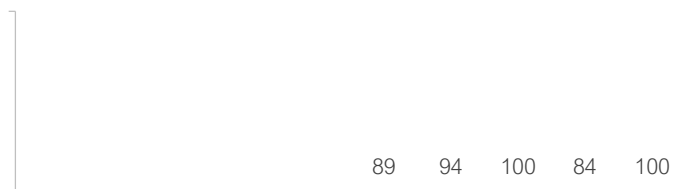
