ABOUT THIS REPORT

This report provides enrollment data for students attending Arizona's public universities in the 2022-23 academic year and updates multi-year enrollment trends. Twenty-first day headcount is provided for each university and their campuses.

Within higher education, enrollment is generally expressed in student headcount or full-time equivalent (FTE) terms. Student headcount is reported to determine educational scale and measurement against the board's strategic metric goals. Headcount is defined as the number of full- or part-time individual students registered at a university for at least one credit hour on the 21st day of instruction. Student headcount is considered a broad measure of a university's educational reach, reflecting the number of individuals the university is educating at one time.

Student enrollment is counted across all education delivery modalities, including online and extended campuses. The report further disaggregates the data into undergraduate, graduate and total enrollment. Data is presented by demographics, full-time and part-time student enrollment semester credit hours, and residency status.

The report also provides an update on each university's progress toward the metric targets for 21st day resident adult undergraduate enrollment.

ABOUT THE ARIZONA BOARD OF REGENTS

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Public university enrollment is an integral component of advancing the state's goal to increase educational attainment. It is a key focus for the board and universities as the state transitions to an economy where the majority of job skills demand education past high school, and most jobs that pay well require a four-year college degree.1

Reporting enrollment reflects whether Arizona's public universities are meeting their mission to provide access to students and produce the number of degrees required to support and improve Arizona's economy.

In fall 2022 – which falls within fiscal year 2023 – enrollment within Arizona's public university system increased with notable growth in the number of students taking online programs. In contrast, Arizona resident enrollment dropped by 2,060 students or 2 percent from last year, a concerning decline in an era where the state's workforce increasingly relies on skills gained through higher education.

During fall 2022, total student enrollment at Arizona's public universities was 220,105, a 3.5 percent increase over fall 2021. Online enrollment continues to drive much of the year-overyear increase.

Arizona's Demographic Changes Pose Challenges to Future Enrollment Increases

In addition to the immediate enrollment shifts resulting from the recent pandemic, future undergraduate enrollment increases may become progressively more difficult due to shifting demographics nationwide and in Arizona. Total Arizona (and U.S.) high school graduate growth is projected to flatten in 2025 and 2026 and then begin to decline.²

Without increases in the percentage of Arizona high school graduates enrolling in a fouryear degree program, demographic reductions may impact Arizona's long-term educational attainment levels.

Declining enrollment affects the universities' financial models. Arizona's divestment in public higher education resulted in the board and universities focusing on diversifying revenue sources. As state support per student decreased, Arizona's public universities funded a greater percentage of their operations through tuition and fees from resident, nonresident and international students to ensure the universities remain financially strong. Slowing enrollment and the change in enrollment mix places greater financial pressure on the universities.

Total Enrollment Continues to Climb Due to Online Enrollment

Online degree program students now comprise 34.4 percent of the system's total enrollment. Arizona State University has the largest online enrollment and, at 43.9 percent online

headcount, is on track to become a majority online institution. Additionally, approximately two out of five Northern Arizona University graduate students are completing an online program.

Online education at the University of Arizona is anticipated to continue to expand in 2023 and beyond as UArizona further integrates the University of Arizona Global Campus.

In the five years since fall 2018 - prior to the pandemic - online degree program enrollment within Arizona's public universities increased by 62.6 percent. In contrast, the system's traditional on-campus undergraduate enrollment grew more slowly. There are 144,310 traditional on-campus undergraduates enrolled – a 1.8 percent year-over-year increase. However, on-campus graduate enrollment also saw an 11.6 percent increase from fall 2018.

Enrollment of Historically Underrepresented Populations Continues to Increase

Enrollment of historically underrepresented populations – Blacks, Hispanics and Native Americans – increased by 3.2 percent from fall 2021, continuing a trend of continuous enrollment growth. In fall 2022, 8,288 Black undergraduate students were enrolled in Arizona's public universities. Arizona's public universities also enrolled 42,874 Hispanic undergraduate students and 2,362 Native American undergraduates.

With the naming of ASU as a Hispanic Serving Institution in June by the U.S. Department of Education, all three of Arizona's public universities are officially recognized as HSIs. An HSI is defined as an institution of higher education with an enrollment of Hispanic undergraduate FTE students that is at least 25 percent of the student body.

Part-Time Student Enrollment Continues to Increase

With the increase in online students, many of whom are part time, overall part-time student enrollment continues to increase. This is important because part-time students traditionally do not graduate at the rate of full-time students. There were 67,632 undergraduate and graduate part-time students enrolled at Arizona's public universities in fall 2022, a 3.9 percent increase from fall 2021 and a 40.9 percent increase from fall 2018.

- Arizona's public universities currently enroll 116,723 nonresident and international students, an 8.8 percent increase from fall 2021.
- Enrollment of Black, Hispanic and Native American students increased. Students from historically underrepresented populations currently comprise 29.7 percent (65,377 students) of enrollment at the universities – a 3.2 percent increase from fall 2021 and 24.5 percent increase from fall 2018. All three of the universities are federally designated HSIs.
- The undergraduate degree program with the largest enrollment at ASU is business with 10,478 students currently enrolled, nursing at NAU with 1,189 students and psychology at UArizona with 1,969 students.
- The master's degree program with the largest enrollment at ASU is special education with 2,462 students currently enrolled, computer information technology at NAU with 432 students and business administration at UArizona with 526 students.
- Approximately 4,782 students are enrolled in degree programs at statewide learning centers and locations.
- Since fall 2018, undergraduate enrollment grew 14.9 percent from 151,507 to 174,126. Graduate enrollment also increased 30.1 percent during that time from 35,334 to 45,979.
- This fall, the majority of undergraduate students (on-campus and online) enrolled in Arizona's public universities were Arizona residents. These 88,032 resident students were joined by 86,094 nonresident students, of which 6,842 were international students

ARIZONA PUBLIC UNIVERSITY ENTERPRISE ENROLLMENT TRENDS

Arizona State University

ASU enrolled 112,171 undergraduate students, a 4.4 percent increase of 4,746 students from fall 2021. Arizona residents comprised 45.8 percent of ASU's undergraduate students in fall 2022. Of the 60,852 nonresident students enrolled, 4,497 or 7.4 percent are international students.

ASU enrolls 43.4 percent of its students in online degree programs – 17.7 percent of whom are Arizona residents. ASU's online degree program enrollment was 62,551 in fall 2022, an 8.1 percent increase from fall 2021 and a 67.4 percent increase from fall 2018. ASU online degree program enrollment is comprised of three-quarters undergraduate and one-quarter graduate students with 46,679 online undergraduates and 15,872 online graduate students. ASU's online growth puts it on track to soon become a majority online institution.

In fall 2022, ASU enrolled 587 students in statewide learning centers throughout Arizona, including locations in Gila Valley, Lake Havasu and Yuma.

ASU's undergraduate students are 55 percent female (61,656) and 31.4 percent (35,205 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American, a 5.1 percent enrollment increase from fall 2021 and a 34.9 percentage increase over fall 2018.

ASU's graduate enrollment for fall 2022 is 30,445, surpassing last year's graduate enrollment by 2,141 students or 7.6 percent.

Northern Arizona University

NAU enrolled 23,204 undergraduate students, a 4 percent enrollment loss (958 students) from fall 2021 and a 14.3. percent enrollment loss (3,868 students) since fall 2018. This is due in part to the graduation of the larger first-time class that entered in fall 2018 and smaller first-time classes in the three subsequent years. Arizona residents comprised 67.9 percent of NAU's undergraduate students in fall 2022. Of the 7,450 nonresident students enrolled, 444 or 6 percent are international students.

NAU enrolls 17.6 percent of its students in online degree programs – 62.9 percent of whom are Arizona residents. NAU's online and degree programs enrollment without personalized learning was 4,159 in fall 2022, a 15.8 percent decrease from fall 2021. NAU online degree program enrollment is comprised of 58.8 percent undergraduate and 41.2 percent graduate students with 2,903 online undergraduates and 2,030 online graduate students.

Another 774 students or 2.8 percent are enrolled in NAU's personalized learning programs. In fall 2021, NAU enrolled 2,192 students in statewide learning centers with locations throughout Arizona and partnerships with every community college in Arizona.

NAU's undergraduate students are 63.2 percent female (14,654) and 32 percent (7,436 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American – a 2.4 percent enrollment decrease from fall 2021 and an 8.9 percentage decrease over fall 2018.

NAU's graduate enrollment for fall 2022 is 4,882, surpassing last year's graduate enrollment by 333 students or 7.3 percent.

University of Arizona

UArizona enrolled 38,751 undergraduate students, a 3.5 percent enrollment increase of 1,317 students from fall 2021. Arizona residents comprised 54.1 percent of UArizona's undergraduate students in fall 2022. Of the 17,792 nonresident students enrolled, 1,901 or 10.7 percent are international students.

UArizona enrolls 16.8 percent of its students in online degree programs – 21.9 percent of whom are Arizona residents. UArizona's online degree program enrollment was 8,311 in fall 2022, a 10.5 percent increase from fall 2021. UArizona online degree program enrollment is comprised of 65.9 percent undergraduate and 34.1 percent graduate students with 5,479 online undergraduates and 2,832 online graduate students.

In fall 2022, UArizona enrolled 2,003 students in statewide learning centers throughout Arizona, including 90 at its College of Applied Science and Technology in Sierra Vista and 766 graduate and professional students at the Phoenix Biomedical Campus. UArizona also enrolled students in Chandler, Douglas, Gilbert and Santa Cruz.


UArizona's undergraduate students are 55.6 percent female (21,538) and 33 percent (12,787 students) are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American – a 2.9 percent enrollment increase from fall 2021 and a 15.9 percentage increase over fall 2018.

UArizona's graduate enrollment for fall 2022 is 10,652, short of last year's graduate enrollment by 188 students or 1.7 percent.

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit ASU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets





Exhibit ASU.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount and Enterprise Goals

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Graduate Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit ASU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours

Exhibit ASU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit ASU.FE.17: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours





Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit NAU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets





Exhibit NAU.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount and Enterprise Goals

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Graduate Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit NAU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit NAU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours



Exhibit NAU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.19: Twenty-First Day First-Time Undergraduate Headcount By Residency



Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit UA.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets





Exhibit UA.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount and Enterprise Goals

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Graduate Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit UA.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit UA.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours



Exhibit UA.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.19: Twenty-First Day First-Time Undergraduate Headcount By Residency
