

REPORT**





ABOUT THIS REPORT

The Academic Year 2026 Enrollment Report provides enrollment data for students attending Arizona's public universities for the fall of 2025 and updates multi-year enrollment trends. Twenty-first day headcount is provided for each university and their campuses.

Within higher education, enrollment is generally expressed in student headcount or full-time equivalent (FTE) terms. Student headcount is reported to determine educational scale and measurement against the board's strategic metric goals. Headcount is defined as the number of full- or part-time individual students registered at a university for at least one credit hour on the 21st day of instruction. Student headcount is considered a broad measure of a university's educational reach, reflecting the number of individuals the university is educating at one time.

Student enrollment is counted across all education delivery modalities, including online and extended campuses, with exceptions as noted. The report further disaggregates the data into undergraduate, graduate and total enrollment. Data is presented by demographics, full-time and part-time student enrollment semester credit hours, and residency status. The report also provides an update on each university's progress toward the metric targets for 21st day resident adult undergraduate enrollment.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Public university enrollment is an integral component of advancing the state's goal to increase educational attainment. It is a key focus for the board and universities as Arizona needs 26,300 more bachelor's degrees annually to support the state's economy.¹

Total enrollment increases again, largely due to online enrollment growth

Total student enrollment at Arizona's public universities in fall 2025 was 241,493, a 1.6 percent increase over fall 2024. This is the highest enrollment in Arizona public universities' history. Total enrollment continues to climb primarily due to online programs. In fall 2025, 96,270 students attended an online program at an Arizona public university, reaching 39.9 percent of total enrollment.

Unless otherwise noted, the figures above and throughout this report exclude the 23,070 additional online students enrolled in the University of Arizona Global Campus (UAGC) in Q1 of academic year 2026 (July-September 2025). Those students enroll throughout the year in courses not synchronized to a regular semester and therefore they cannot be appropriately counted in a one-time 21st-day snapshot to match the data in this report.² Selected UAGC figures are included in the text of the University of Arizona section below.

Online enrollment has been increasing nonetheless – in the past five years, online enrollment at Arizona's public universities without UAGC increased by 35.6 percent. With the inclusion of UAGC, Arizona is the largest public university system provider of online programs in the country.³

In contrast, the state's traditional on-campus undergraduate enrollment at its public universities saw enrollment decline. There are 120,574 traditional on-campus students enrolled at Arizona State University (ASU), Northern Arizona University (NAU) and the University of Arizona (UA) – a 2.8 percent decrease from last fall.

Undergraduate Arizona residents continue to grow

Arizona resident (i.e., in-state) undergraduate enrollment at the three public universities grew to 92,433 in fall 2025, an increase of 2.6 percent over last year. In-state students represent 48.6 percent of all undergraduates this year, up slightly from 48.0 percent in fall 2024. Tuition for non-resident (i.e., out-of-state) students is nearly triple that for Arizona residents and attracting non-resident students helps to offset lower tuition for students from our state. On-campus nonresident undergraduate enrollments are down 10.6 percent from last year, although this decline is erased when combined with matching online enrollments for an overall increase of 0.2 percent. These figures also exclude UAGC as explained above.

Women continue to attend Arizona public universities at higher numbers than men

Nationally, more women attend college than men, with 58 percent of undergraduate students enrolled in a four-year institution nationwide.⁴ That share matches enrollment of women at Arizona's public universities. Overall, across the three institutions, 55.9 percent of undergraduate students are women, essentially unchanged from last year and up 0.3 percentage points over the last five years.

At ASU, 55.1 percent of undergraduate students are women with a 0.2 percentage point increase over the last five years. NAU's undergraduate students are 63.0 percent women, which is unchanged over the last five years. UA's undergraduate students are 54.6 percent women, down 0.5 percentage points over the last five years.

International enrollments decline

Federal changes to student visa processing have resulted in decreased international student enrollments nationwide.⁵ Across the three Arizona public universities, overall international enrollment is down 8.2 percent over last year (-2.1 percent undergraduate and -12.7 percent graduate). This year, 6.8 percent of all enrolled students are international with a greater share at the graduate level (17.3 percent) versus the undergraduate level (3.9 percent).

Arizona State University

- **Driven by its online programs, ASU's enrollment continues to increase.** ASU is among the largest universities in the nation, and its total enrollment continues to increase, seeing historic enrollment growth in fall 2025 driven by its growing online programs. ASU enrolled 160,114 students in fall 2025 — 124,753 undergraduate students (4.2 percent increase) and 35,361 graduate students (6.7 percent increase). ASU's online enrollment growth has been especially significant — increasing by 11.7 percent to 81,562 students in the last year and 41 percent in the last five years. This year ASU passed a significant milestone: it is now a majority online institution, enrolling 50.9 percent of its students in online degree programs. Almost 63 percent of ASU's online students are part-time. Approximately three-quarters of ASU's online students are undergraduates, and about 84 percent of those are nonresident.
- **On-campus enrollment decreased from fall 2024 but remains up over the past five years.** ASU's on-campus enrollment in fall 2025 decreased by 788 undergraduate students (-1.2 percent) and decreased by 526 graduate students (-3.6 percent), but still has a combined net growth of 524 students (0.7 percent) compared to fall 2021. New on-campus undergraduates grew in fall 2025, with 999 more first-time and transfer students enrolled at ASU. More Arizona residents also chose to attend ASU on-campus as undergraduates this year, increasing by 516 students (1.2 percent). However, over the last five years, Arizona resident undergraduate enrollment decreased by -0.4 percent, while nonresidents increased by 0.6 percent.

- **Online nonresident undergraduate students increase at ASU.** The total number of on-campus plus online nonresident undergraduates increased by 5.9 percent to 71,375 in fall 2025. Together, these nonresident undergraduates now represent over 57 percent of all undergraduate students at ASU. The total combines a decrease of 1,304 on-campus nonresident students (to 20,867) with a 5,279 increase in online nonresidents (to 50,508).
- **ASU continues to enroll more low income and historically underrepresented undergraduate students.** ASU's charter states that the university will be measured not by whom it excludes, but by whom it includes and how they succeed. In fall 2025, 37.7 percent of ASU's undergraduate students qualified for Pell grants, a 0.7 percentage point increase from last year. Additionally, 34.0 percent of ASU undergraduate students are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American – a 1.3 percentage point increase in that share from fall 2024 and an overall enrollment growth of 26.6 percent in underrepresented undergraduate students over the last five years.

Northern Arizona University

- **NAU's overall enrollment declined from the previous fall.** NAU's total enrollment shrank year-over-year with 27,183 students in fall 2025, a 4.5% decrease. Undergraduate enrollment declined by 788 (3.4 percent) to 22,202 students, while graduate enrollment declined by 496 (-9.1 percent) to 4,981. After several years of stable undergraduate enrollment around 23,000 and many years of rising graduate enrollment, this year's declines reflect strong shifts in non-resident and international enrollments for both those categories that offset rises in Arizona resident enrollment.
- **NAU enrolls more in-state students with a steep decline in out-of-state students.** In recent years, NAU implemented its Access2Excellence (A2E) tuition program⁶ and changed its criteria for undergraduate guaranteed admission – both aligned with its access mission — resulting in strengthened Arizona resident undergraduate enrollments. The fall 2025 total Arizona resident undergraduate enrollment is 17,163, a 5.7 percent increase over last year. Arizona residents now comprise 77.3 percent of NAU's undergraduate students. In contrast, undergraduate non-resident enrollment dropped precipitously by more than 25 percent, from 6,755 in fall 2024 to 5,039 in fall 2025. Most of the decline was in out-of-state domestic students, although international undergraduate enrollment decreased by 96 students or (-19.8 percent).
- **First-time and transfer students decreased at NAU this fall.** In fall 2025 the number of first-time and transfer students at NAU was 6,174, a decrease of 403 (-6.1 percent) over last year. NAU is continuing its multi-year Arizona Attainment Alliance (A++) program with Arizona's community colleges to help increase the number of transfer students. Among first-time nonresident students enrolled, 13.7 percent are part of the Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) program, a 1.3 percentage point decrease since last year, while all non-Arizona residents made up 17.0 percent of first-year students, a 5.1 percentage point decrease.

- **Undergraduates from historically underrepresented groups continue to increase.** As part of its charter, NAU aims to be the nation's preeminent engine of opportunity, vehicle of economic mobility, and driver of social impact by delivering equitable postsecondary value in Arizona and beyond. NAU's proportion of Pell students is 34.6 percent, a 0.2 percentage point increase over last year, although Pell enrollment decreased to 7,677 as part of NAU's overall enrollment decline. Almost 36 percent of NAU's undergraduates are from historically underrepresented student populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American. This year's total of 7,972 is a 1.8 percent increase over fall 2024.


University of Arizona

- **University of Arizona enrollment returned to prior year levels.** After a spike last year, fall 2025 enrollment at U of A returned to prior year levels (although still the second largest in its history) with 54,196 students (-3.8 percent). This total includes Arizona Online but excludes 23,070 UAGC students for Q1 2026, as explained above – the blended total is therefore 77,266 students. Total undergraduate enrollment decreased by 3.9 percent and graduate enrollment decreased by 3.7 percent. Undergraduate first-time and transfer students contributed the largest part of the decrease, with a 14.5 percent drop from fall 2024.
- **UA increases online enrollment.** The U of A now enrolls 18.7 percent of its students in Arizona Online (excluding UAGC), with fall 2025 online enrollment at 10,147, a 3.3 percent increase from fall 2024. Slightly over 69 percent of Arizona Online students are undergraduates. The UAGC Q1 2026 enrollment of 23,070 is a 10.8 percent decrease from Q1 2025. Just over 76 percent of UAGC students are undergraduates.
- **Arizona resident enrollment is up in fall 2025.** In-state enrollments of undergraduates across all modalities total 21,892, a 1.6 percent increase over fall 2024. The proportion of resident students is 50.8 percent, a 2.8 percentage point increase over last year. Out-of-state undergraduate enrollment decreased by 8.9 percent to 21,218 in fall 2025. UAGC enrolled 1,435 in-state undergraduates in Q1 2026, representing 8.2 percent of all undergraduates and a 0.9 percentage point increase over Q1 2025.
- **UA slightly increased the number of historically underrepresented undergraduate students.** At 34 percent in fall 2025, the share of U of A undergraduates from historically underrepresented populations – Black, Hispanic or Native American – increased by 1.4 percentage points from fall 2024. This year's total of 14,638 is a 17.8 percent increase over the last five years. In Q1 2026 UAGC enrolled 9,090 undergraduates from historically underrepresented populations, a 51.7 percent share of all UAGC undergraduates.
- **The percentage of Pell students increased at the U of A.** In fall 2025, the share of students with federal Pell grant support for their undergraduate studies at the U of A increased to 25.6 percent, a 0.7 percentage point increase over last year. At UAGC about one-third of undergraduates are Pell students.

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions





Exhibit E.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets





Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount




Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions





Exhibit ASU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets



Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions




Exhibit ASU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.5: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours

Exhibit ASU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit ASU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours










Exhibit ASU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours








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



Exhibit ASU.FE.24: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Race Ethnicity and Gender



Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions





Exhibit NAU.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets





Exhibit NAU.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours



Exhibit NAU.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit NAU.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours












Exhibit NAU.FE.18: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Arizona Residency and Credit Hours






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Exhibit NAU.FE.19: Twenty-First Day First-Time Undergraduate Headcount By Residency

Non-Arizona US Residents by Home State








Exhibit NAU.FE.23: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Race Ethnicity and Gender


Exhibit NAU.FE.24: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Race Ethnicity and Gender

Cumulative Percentage Change versus All US Public Bachelor's Degree Granting Institutions





Exhibit UA.FE.2: Twenty-First Day Resident Adult Undergraduate Headcount and Enterprise Metric Targets




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Exhibit UA.FE.3: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount

Exhibit UA.FE.4: Twenty-First Day Undergraduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours



Exhibit UA.FE.6: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Instructional Modality and Credit Hours




Exhibit UA.FE.7: Twenty-First Day Graduate Headcount by Geographic Site and Credit Hours




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Exhibit UA.FE.8: Twenty-First Day Headcount by Program Level, Student Type and Credit Hours





Major Residency Classifications






